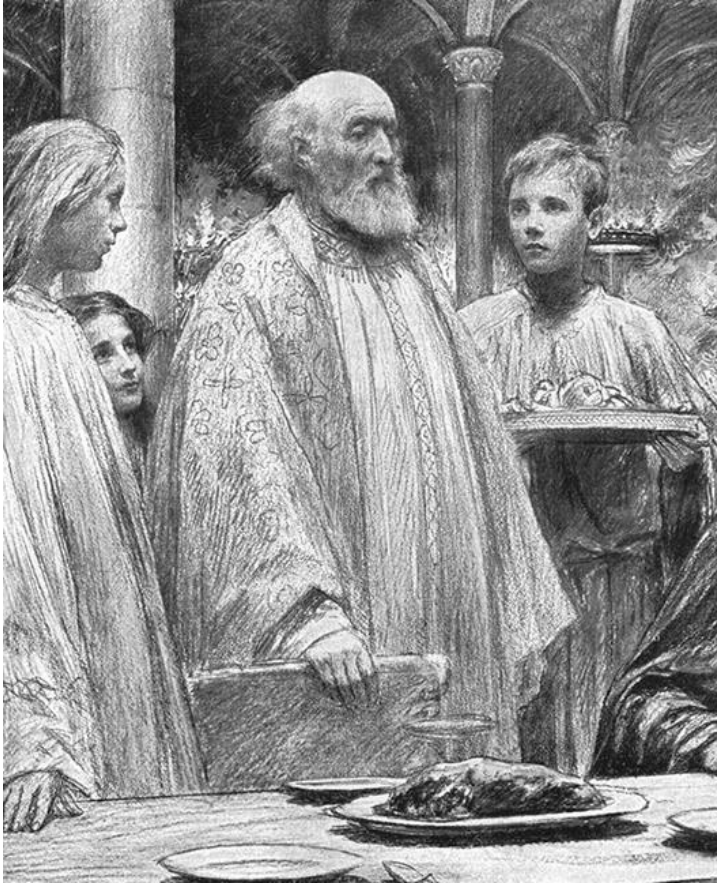

**THE FEAST OF ST. LUKE THE EVANGELIST** will be observed with a special Dominican Rite Mass on Wednesday, October 18 at 7:00 PM. Liturgical music will include Palestrina's *Missa 'Iste confessor'* sung by Cantores in Ecclesia. A wine & cheese reception will follow the Mass in Siena Hall.

**SAINT LUKE** is described in one of the Pauline epistles as "my dear friend, Luke, the doctor" (Colossians 4:14). He is the author of the third gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. Both Eusebius and Jerome say he was probably a Greek and may have come from Antioch. Where and when he wrote his gospel are uncertain, though it was probably between 70 and 90 (Eusebius says before Paul's death, Jerome says after). Saint Luke is the patron of painters and physicians and is represented in art as an ox.
