Holy Rosary is pleased to announce that Fr. Corwin Low, O.P. will be joining us as Parochial Vicar after the beginning of the year.



Fr. Corwin Low comes to Portland ready for the rain, having spent over a decade in the “golden state” of California. That doesn't pose a huge problem since he hails from the Pacific Northwest. A native of Seattle, Fr. Low is a rather late vocation. He studied Electrical Engineering and Computer Science at the University of Washington. After graduation, he started work for Paul Allen first as a developer for his software company, and then as a design engineer for his holding and investment company, Vulcan, Inc. before embarking on his own

and starting a successful computer and network security firm. Dissatisfied with high-tech industry and its material goals, Fr. Low sought the answers to life's bigger questions which eventually led him to the doors of the Catholic Church. Five years later he joined the Dominican Order and was ordained as a priest in 2014.

Fr. Low enjoys traveling and trekking (which has been greatly curbed since his entrance into the Dominicans), hiking, reading, technology, and sacred music. Above all, the celebration of the sacraments is his most important task, and it gives him great joy to see grace at work in the people to which he ministers. He is very much enthusiastic about this new assignment at Holy Rosary Parish.

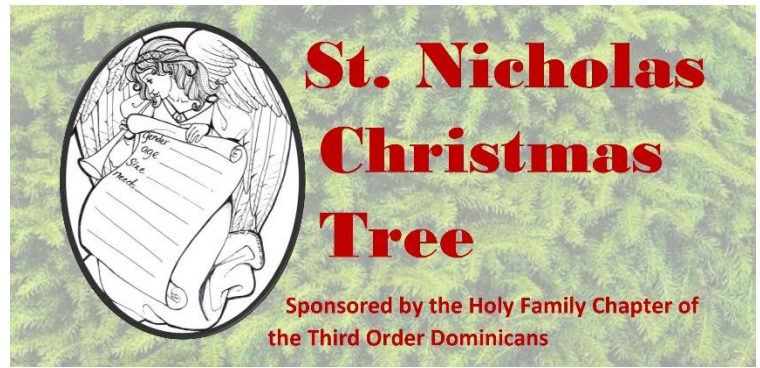
