THE EXPOSITION OF THE MOST BLESSED SACRAMENT AT HOLY ROSARY CHURCH

"From the Eucharist comes strength to live the Christian life and zeal to share that life with others." -Pope Saint John Paul II

Our parish is privileged to be a House of Prayer dedicated to the Sacred Liturgy, to the veneration of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, and to the Adoration of our Eucharistic Lord. The Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament occurs on a regularly scheduled basis on weekdays following the Noon Mass until 7:30 PM. Our prayer and worship provide a wonderful opportunity for personal sanctification, is a means of intercession for the world, and provides a sanctuary of prayer in the midst of the city.

St. Alphonsus Liguori writing on the power of Eucharistic Adoration says, "Know also that you will probably gain more by praying...before the Blessed Sacrament than by all the other spiritual exercises of the day....He has revealed to His servants that those who visit Him in the Blessed Sacrament will obtain a more abundant measure of grace." As Lent approaches I would encourage you who can to sign up for a Holy Hour at Holy Rosary. A commitment can help form a good habit of personal prayer and signing up for one of our most needed hours ensures that this great ministry and opportunity will continue for all who visit our church.
