REGARDING PANHANDLING AT HOLY ROSARY CHURCH

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me." (Matt. 25:35)

Care for the poorest among us is an essential part of being a Catholic. The Catechism states that "The Church's love for the poor is a part of her constant tradition. This love is inspired by the Gospel of the Beatitudes, of the poverty of Jesus, and of his concern for the poor." (CCC, 2444) Assistance of the impoverished is a work belonging to all of us and not only to the wealthy, to government, or to certain members of the Church. St. Thomas Aquinas writes that "Whatever certain people have in superabundance is due, by natural law, to the purpose of succoring the poor." (ST II-II, Q. 66, AA 7)

There are many individuals and families in need in the Portland region and around Holy Rosary Church. However, I would strongly discourage direct monetary assistance to those who ask on and around church property. Instead, I would urge you all to heed the commands of Christ and give what you can to support good ecclesial and secular charities, St. Vincent de Paul, and our own St. Martin de Porres food pantry. Assisting the poor requires both generosity and careful discernment, but for the sake of the children, vulnerable members of the parish, and our friars who live right here at the church, I request that you not give money to panhandlers or anyone else. Instead, give to the church and charities, offer to buy the hungry a meal, or consider handing out small packaged food items or items of clothing such as socks instead. Thank you for your consideration on this matter!
