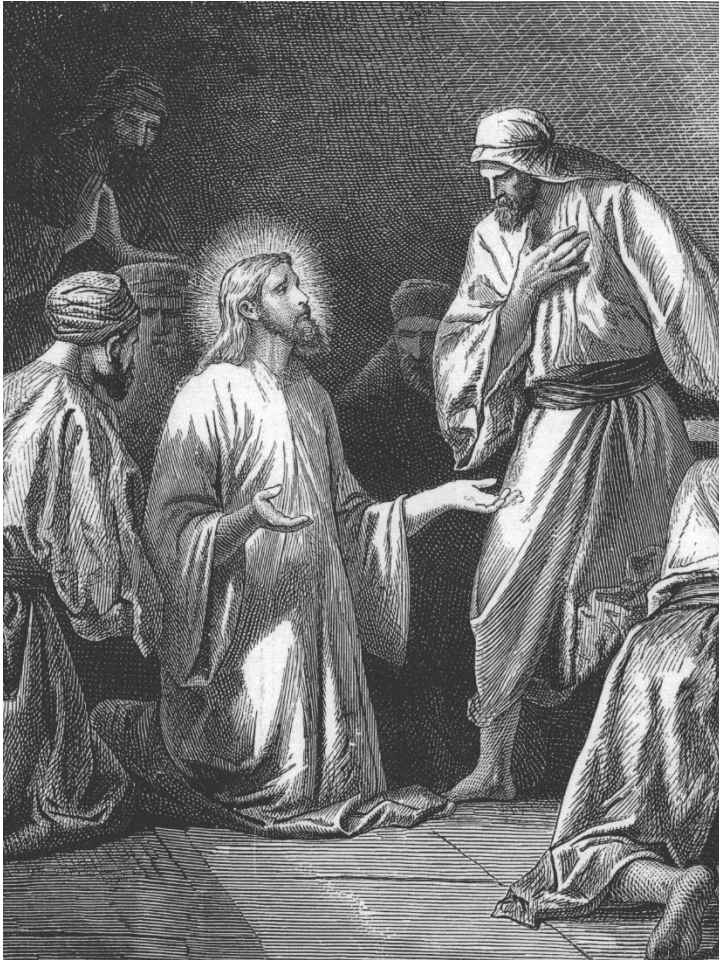

ASCENSION THURSDAY

On May 10th at 7:00 PM, we will observe the traditional date of the Feast of the Ascension, according to the Dominican Rite. Cantores in Ecclesia will sing Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina's *Missa 'Viri Galilaei'*. The Masses in the Ordinary Form on May 10th (7 AM, Noon) will honor St. Antoninus, the great 15th c. Dominican Archbishop of Florence. ON THURSDAY, forty days after our Lord's resurrection, still in the Paschal cycle, is kept the anniversary of the day that marked the end of his visible reign on earth. It also marks the beginning of the original novena of the Church, that of nine days of prayer in preparation of the coming of the Holy Spirit. ON SUNDAY, because of the decision made by the Bishops of our region, the Ascension will also be observed at all Masses, except for the 11 AM Dominican Rite Mass, which will be that of the Sunday after Ascension. Therefore Sunday, not Thursday, is the Holy Day of Obligation.

REGARDING ARCHDIOCESAN LITURGICAL CHANGES

“Enter, let us bow down in worship; let us kneel before the LORD who made us.”

Beginning on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ this year, Archbishop Sample has determined that certain changes will be made to the rubrics of the Mass throughout the Archdiocese. While these changes will have little impact on the celebration of the Sacred liturgy at Holy Rosary, it is important to know when we visit other parishes.

Beginning on Corpus Christi during the celebration of Holy Mass, after the Lamb of God, the faithful will kneel. The current General Instruction of the Roman Missal states that: “The faithful kneel after the Agnus Dei unless the diocesan Bishop determines otherwise.” Previously, the Archdiocese had instructed that the faithful remain standing after the Lamb of God. Archbishop Sample has determined that a more reverent celebration of the Eucharist will be aided by a change in this posture. Kneeling is a posture of adoration and has been part of the Communion Rite for many centuries. By kneeling after the Lamb of God, the faithful prepare for the moment in which the priest presents to them the Sacrificed Lamb [Ecce Agnus Dei - Behold the Lamb of God]. This posture of adoration is most appropriate before the reception of Holy Communion. After the Lamb of God the faithful should remain kneeling until they move from their place to receive Holy Communion. The tradition of remaining kneeling after the reception of Holy Communion until the priest has returned to his seat is to be commended. Those who cannot kneel due to infirmity or other impediment should be seated so as to not impede the view of those who kneel.

This change will unite us with the Universal Church, the majority of the dioceses in the United States and indeed the other diocese in the State of Oregon. More importantly Archbishop Sample believes it will enhance the reverent participation of the faithful at Holy Mass and increase their devotion to the Holy Eucharist. This change will take effect beginning at all Masses of The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, 3 June 2018.
