

## FEDERAL RULES FOR CHECKED BAGGAGE AND PASSENGER TRANSPORTATION

### TRANSPORTATION OF FIREARMS

TSA regulations require that firearms in checked baggage must be declared, unloaded, and placed in a locked, hard-sided container. Passengers failing to declare firearms or passengers transporting loaded firearms are subject to substantial civil and/or criminal penalties per violation.

### UNAUTHORIZED INCENDIARY OR EXPLOSIVE DEVICES

Federal regulations prohibit lighters, matches, certain flammable liquids, and spare lithium batteries in checked baggage. Each passenger may bring a common lighter (Bic, Zippo) and one (1) book of safety matches.

### HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

- 1. Federal law forbids carriage of hazardous materials aboard aircraft in your luggage or on your person.** A violation can result in five years' imprisonment and penalties of \$250,000 or more (49 U.S.C. 5124). Hazardous materials include explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives, and radioactive materials. Examples: Paints, lighter fluid, fireworks, tear gases, oxygen bottles, and radio-pharmaceuticals.
- 2.** There are special exceptions for small quantities (up to 70 ounces total) of medicinal, toilet articles carried in your luggage, and certain smoking materials carried on your person. For further information, contact your XTRA Airways representative.
