Our Mission

Three Oaks Center is working to return homeless individuals and families to stable living. We provide emergency, transitional and permanent supportive housing to individuals and families in need. It is our mission to prevent homelessness where possible, break the cycle of homelessness by providing individuals and families with stabilization, supportive housing and life coaching. We also strive to mobilize our citizens to support and participate in the restoration of homeless individuals and families in our community.

Case Management

Three Oaks Center's case advocates are experienced professionals trained to have a unique understanding of Veteran needs. Case advocates provide an organized, structured process for moving participants through the process of change and toward the goal of self-sufficiency.

- Comprehensively assess individual needs and situations
- Create a service plan to achieve housing and financial stability
- Provide linkages to community partners and essential resources
- Monitor progress toward goals and reevaluate service plans as needed
- Provide advocacy in the local community and at the Veterans Administration Facility to meet the needs of veterans and their families

Temporary Financial Assistance

Three Oaks Center's Veteran's (SSVF) Program offers limited financial assistance to veterans to help to end or prevent homelessness. Available assistance includes:

- Rent fees
- Utility fees
- Security or utility deposits
- Moving costs
- Purchase of emergency supplies
- Transportation
- Child Care



How to Make Referrals

Referral forms can be found at our website at threeoakscenter.org.

Eligible SSVF Veterans:

- At least one day of active military service
- Discharge other than dishonorable
- Very low income
- Must be at imminent risk of becoming homeless
- Newly homeless (within past three months)
- Homeless but scheduled to be rehoused (within three months)

In addition to the SSVF program, Three Oaks Center offers emergency, transitional and permanent supportive housing programs and may provide referrals and linkages to other services provided by our community partners.
