

## Worksheet: Why Do People Move?

Type of Immigrant		Definition
<b>Asylum seeker</b>		A person who is studying at school, college or university. People who want to study in the UK who are from a country that is part of the European Union do not have to apply for a visa. A person from outside the EU has to apply for a visa; the visa is not necessarily permanent and is usually just for the duration the person is studying for.
<b>Refugee</b>		A person who migrates from one country to another for work. People from the European Union (EU) are free to work and live in the UK <b>without a visa</b> ; people from the UK are also free to move to these countries <b>without a visa</b> . People who come from outside the EU, would have to <b>apply for a visa through</b> a strict system on the Home Office website.
<b>Economic Migrant</b>		Someone who has <b>lodged an application</b> for protection on the basis of: Fear of persecution, lack of protection due to human rights violations, armed conflict in their own country, trafficking (for exploitation), escaping extreme deprivation and poverty.
<b>Student</b>		A person who is residing outside the country of her or his origin due to fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion. This person has been officially <b>given permission to stay</b> in the country, sometimes for a limited period of time, sometimes indefinitely.
