



How to Produce a FIRMette:

It is suggested that you print these instructions so you can read along as you proceed.

1. Type <http://www.msc.fema.gov/> in your browser.
2. Enter your address in the space provided.
3. After the **Search Results** appears, click on the magnifying glass under **View**.
4. The maps are very slow to load, so you'll need to be patient. Each time you zoom in or out, the map will (slowly) reload.
5. The map that appears will be small and it may be difficult to find your property. Click on the map to enlarge it.
6. Try to identify nearby landmarks, such as freeways, major streets, shopping malls, etc.
7. Use the tool buttons on the left side of the page to zoom in on your property.
8. Once you have identified where your property is, click on the button labeled **Make a FIRMette**.
9. Select a page size.
10. Click and drag the shaded square with the green border over your property.
11. Create the FIRMette by clicking on either the **Adobe PDF*** or **Image File** button.
12. Click on **Save Your FIRMette**.
13. Click on **Open** to view your FIRMette, or **Save** to file.

*Adobe PDF Reader is required.

How to View Letters of Map Change:

It is suggested that you print these instructions so you can read along as you proceed.

1. Type <http://www.msc.fema.gov/> in your browser.
2. Enter your address in the space provided.
3. After the **Search Results** appears, click on the Amendments folders under **Letters of Map Change**.
4. Click on the pdf icons to find the LOMC you are interested in.

How to View FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps:

1. Type <http://www.msc.fema.gov/> in your browser.
2. Enter your address in the space provided.
3. After the **Search Results** appears, click on the magnifying glass under **View**.

How to View Historic FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Maps:

It is suggested that you print these instructions so you can read along as you proceed.

1. Type <http://www.msc.fema.gov/> in your browser.
2. Click on **Search All Products** in blue text.
3. Under Jurisdiction enter State, County, and Community data using pull down menus. Click on Search box.
4. Click on **Historic Flood Maps**.
5. Select FIRM Panels
6. If you do not know the map panel number, you should first open the Index map which is identified as "IND0" in the Product ID number with corresponding Effective Date.
7. The maps as they first appear will be small and it will be difficult to find your property. Click on the map to enlarge it.
8. Try to identify nearby landmarks, such as freeways and major streets.
9. Use the tool buttons on the left side of the page to zoom to an area (look for panel number).
10. Go to previous web page, use Product ID values for panel numbers. View corresponding Historical FEMA Flood Insurance Rate Map.
