Campus Coordinator (CC)

Duties and Responsibilities

Campus Coordinators are the official representatives of SDSN Youth within their university and campus. Their role is to mobilise their campus and student groups behind the 2030 Agenda through events, campaigns and projects.

The primary responsibilities of Campus Coordinators include:

- **Promote**
 - Campus Coordinators serve as official representatives of SDSN Youth within their university and campus. In this capacity, their role is to engage student groups and organisations in the work of SDSN Youth. In particular Campus Coordinators have a role to promote projects, campaigns and tools produced by SDSN Youth in order to help student groups better understand sustainable development and engage more closely with the localisation of the SDGs within their campus.
- **Organize**
 - Campus Coordinators are expected to organize a university wide event in October 2017. This event will serve to inform the university community about the SDGs but also give students an opportunity to identify pathways and initiatives for localising and achieving the SDGs by 2030 in their community.
- **Open Portfolio**
 - In addition to 'promotion' and 'organizing, Campus Coordinators each have another responsibility. Although this responsibility is only determined by the Network Coordinator. Portfolios may include; communications, events, campaigns, advocacy, projects, operations, research.

Criteria

PRIMARY Criteria

At time of applying for this role:

- Candidate **MUST** be based at the institution/university they are seeking to represent - either as an official student or employee (university and institution must be an official Member Institution of the SDSN - check list here).
- Candidate **MUST** possess a basic command of the English language.
- Candidate **MUST** demonstrate that they have the time and resources to commit to this role – candidates with full time jobs and overlapping commitments will be exempt from running for this position.
- Candidate **MUST** be able to commit at least between 10 hours per week for this role.
- Candidate **MUST** be aged between 18-30 in order to be eligible for this role.

SECONDARY Criteria

At the time of applying for this role:

- **COMMITMENT** - Candidate SHOULD be able to demonstrate that they are committed to the vision of the Network and capable of working in compliance with the norms, and standards set by SDSN Youth and their respective Regional/National Networks.
- **PUBLIC SPEAKING** - Candidate SHOULD be a confident and passionate speaker, capable of communicating well with stakeholders and partners.
- **DISCIPLINE** - Candidate SHOULD be incredibly well disciplined and have excellent organisational and management skills.
- **FLEXIBILITY** - Candidate SHOULD be flexible and capable of working with multiple deadlines and coordinate activities with multiple time zones - this may include late night calls and meetings.
- **VERSATILITY** - Candidate SHOULD be versatile, especially in dealing with the challenges posed by a newly formed, constantly changing and rapidly expanding organisation.
