## BOOK RECOMMENDATION FROM FR. THOMAS AQUINAS

Dear Book fiends,

Sickness, suffering, and death: these are inescapable realities of human life. While those who live without hope will go to any length to avoid these realities, we



Christians have a profound, God-given wisdom that allows to unlock their deeper meaning and possibility. In his short book, The Theology of Illness, Dr. Jean-Claude Larchet offers a patristic-laden analysis of human suffering in the light of Christ's redemption. Coming from an Orthodox position, Dr. Larchet first uncovers the origin of sickness and death, and then proceeds to share the Christian paths toward healing that are available to those within the Church. Looking at illness in the light of faith, especially during a time of pandemic, helps to remember how "the body will fulfill its ultimate destiny of being deified along with the soul in the human hypostasis" (p. 131). While I would, of course, insert some Thomistic caveats here and there (especially in light of the surnaturel controversies of the 20th century), I heartily recommend this accessible book full of wonderful quotes from the Church Fathers.
