Founded in October 2015 by Mr. Littlepage, Tribal Diagnostics works as a premiere high complexity diagnostics laboratory located in Oklahoma that supports all health care providers with a focus on tribal and rural communities.

“I started Tribal Diagnostics because I saw a need to provide high volume, specialized testing that most providers may not be able to do themselves. We provide fast and accurate results and we’re dedicated to our providers,” said Mr. Littlepage, who as CEO is responsible for the strategic growth and operations of the company. Tribal Diagnostics offers the most current, sensitive and accurate technology for urine drug testing, which is the company’s core competency.

“I am saddened to see that opioid abuse is rampant in our tribal and rural communities.
