Increasing the Frequency of Bible Engagement

1. Establish a common baseline for everyone in your group by studying what the Bible says it is.

Four Ways to Engage with the Bible

Study it: Acts 17:11, 2 Tim. 2:15 (Bible Project Videos, You Version App, Study Bible, Bible Dictionary)

Memorize it: Ps. 37:31, Ps. 119:9-11 - What is your heart?

Share it with others: Rom. 1:15, 1 Thess. 2:8 (Group Me, Facebook Group, You Version group)

Meditate on it: Josh. 1:8, Ps. 1:2-3 Lectio Divina

An Example of Meditation: LECTIO DIVINA

"Lectio Divina", Latin for "sacred reading," is an ancient practice of quiet prayer and reflection, reading scripture and listening to the voice of God, dating back to about 300AD. Lectio can be done alone or in a group. The leader will tell you when to move to the next stage.

REMEMBER:

- Posture is important. Sit straight up, feet on the floor, hands in your lap or to your sides. This is important for attentive listening. While this process can be restful, it is a time to be attentive to God's voice.
- This time is your gift to God. It's not about whether you get something out of it or not. Don't be discouraged if you don't "get it."
- Your mind will wander. Recognize that this happens, even to those who practice *Lectio* often. When you catch yourself, refocus and continue. They don't call them "spiritual practices" for nothing!

Give it a try with these four steps!

Step 1: LECTIO - read (5 minutes)

Scripture passage for today: John 15:1-17

- READ through a short passage of scripture three times
- LISTEN for a specific word or phrase that catches your attention

Word or phrase: _____

Step 2: MEDITATIO - think (5 minutes)

- "Meditate" literally means "to gnaw", as a dog gnaws on a bone.
- Actively think about your word or phrase
- Ask: Why is it important? How does it make me feel?
- You can write notes below.

Step 3: ORATIO - pray (5 minutes)

- Ask, "God, why did you give me this word? Why do I feel this way about this phrase?"
- Listen for a response. Follow your active thoughts (not your distraction thoughts)
- Be patient.

Step 4: CONTEMPLATIO - Live (5 minutes)

- Rest in the love and presence of God, feel his closeness
- Thank God for this word.

Discuss

- How could you lead your group members in meditating on the Bible using Lectio Divina?
- What would your group look after this year if all its members engaged more meaningfully with the Bible?
