

## Irene Hames Wins Publons' Sentinel Award for Championing Peer Review

**19 September 2017 (London, England):** Publons today named Irene Hames the winner of the 2017 Sentinel Award - for outstanding advocacy, innovation or contribution to scholarly peer review.

Irene Hames was a significant contender for the inaugural Sentinel Award, having spent much of her long career in scholarly publishing working on peer review and publication ethics. She has worked tirelessly to help editors, journals and publishers improve the quality of their peer-review and editorial processes, and championed the critical importance of robust peer review amongst the research community.
