Hello Shazma! Let's kick things off with the first question, how and why did you move into your current role within clinical research? Having worked in various roles in academia and healthcare, I am very much familiar with the research operations environment and how crucial this can be in delivering impactful research. Given the depth and breadth of research landscape at Barts Health, I wanted to extend my support to build on our existing strengths while tackling some of the pressing challenges during unprecedented times, thus ensuring continuity in turning our

vision into a reality for improving lives.

### What does your role as **Senior Research Coordinator** at Barts Health entail on a typical day?

My current role mainly involves supporting the finance management of research portfolio for Barts-UCL Cardiovascular (Cancer and Imaging) teams. This means coordinating all aspects of research lifecycle supporting funding applications, governance, contracts, study set-up and delivery. Each day brings something new to the table with an opportunity to collaborate with our dedicated stakeholders (internal and external) to achieve key milestones at every single stage. Also, providing useful insights on key performance metrics to enhance transparency and visibility so informed decisions can be made with respect to resource allocation. As continuous improvement is an integral part of an effective, efficient, and resilient system, I also take initiatives to review and contribute to process development and to advocate for enhancing equity, diversity and inclusion (EDI).

### look like at your organisation? Being one of the largest NHS trusts and leading healthcare providers in England, Barts Health place research at the heart of overall strategy and has been at the forefront of research excellence with exceptional partnerships including being the recent host to NIHR's North London Research Delivery Network for advancing research. Both the Trust and St Bartholomew's Hospital (SBH) led on commercial research activity over last financial year and were among the top trusts and sites for number of studies and recruitment nationally, also topped for the complexity of studies across top recruiting trusts regionally. SBH led on number of studies and recruitment across all sites whereas cardiovascular disease was the second highest recruiting specialty at Barts Health. Having said that, it is just a beginning of an incredible era of innovation by building on our key areas, creating new
