27 Just then his disciples came. They were astonished that he was speaking with a woman, but no one said, "What do you want?" or, "Why are you speaking with her?" 28 Then the woman left her water jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, 29 "Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?" 30 They left the city and were on their way to him.

31 Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, "Rabbi, eat something." 32 But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." 33 So the disciples said to one another, "Surely no one has brought him something to eat?" 34 Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to complete his work. 35 Do you not say, 'Four months more, then comes the harvest'? But I tell you, look around you, and see how the fields are ripe for harvesting. 36 The reaper is already receiving wages and is gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. 37 For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' 38 I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor."

## About the Music

---

Recognizing **Women's History Month**, numerous contributions of women composers to the vast organ repertoire will be highlighted in the organ voluntaries this month.

*Toccata* by Polish composer Weronika Ratusińska is the last movement of "Three sketches" written in 2010. Ratusińska studied in Warsaw (Poland) with Stanisław Moryto and Włodzimierz Kotoński, and in The Hague (The Netherlands) with Louis Andriessen and Martijn Padding. Her oeuvre spans works for small and large ensembles - many of them were awarded prizes and have been performed throughout Europe and recently in the US. *Toccata* utilizes motoric movement and harmonic writing clearly inspired by J. S. Bach's "Prelude in C minor" from the Well-Tempered Clavier - perfect way to celebrate Bach's birthday weekend! What brings this composition to the modern age is its modal language, which helps create a sense of grandeur and solemnity.
