



Though popular opinion credits this prayer to Francis of Assisi, the earliest known printing was in a French religious magazine in 1912. Yet that gentle saint's spirit seems evident in these words, a quality that has spurred many paraphrases and musical settings such as this one.

About the Opening Hymn: *Cantad al Señor* is a well-known Brazilian folk song. Translator and Lutheran missionary Gerhard Cartford translated it from Portuguese to Spanish, then to English for use in US congregations.

About the Closing Hymn: Originally a freedom song from South Africa, this song names light as a symbol of creation and Jesus Christ, as well as the South African movement from struggle and darkness to hope.
