About the Music

The organ music this morning highlights two lesser-known, but prolific composers of the Baroque period. J. J. Mouret was a French composer, who would be obscure today had not PBS made the final movement of the Symphonies de Fanfares popular as the background music for Masterpiece.

Georg Philipp Telemann was a German composer, whose music incorporates French, Italian, and German national styles, and he was at times even influenced by Polish popular music. He is best known for his string and organ compositions.

The lyrics of the hymns and offertory anthem describe our unity in Church and in Christ, and that we who are created in God's image are called to live in ways that reflect our Creator's values: justice, joy, compassion and peace.
