## About the Music

---

It was customary for Baroque composers to copy one another's music. In fact, it was considered a compliment. All of the organ music this morning was originally a concerto for orchestra and 2 violins by Antonio Vivaldi. J. S. Bach admired several of Vivaldi's compositions and transcribed them for the organ.

Singing psalms was the main staple of congregational singing when the Presbyterian church was founded. Today we include psalm singing, both to highlight the psalm and to give the congregation their own voice in praying Psalm 130.
