Scripture

Luke 23:33-43

33 When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. [[34 Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."]] And they cast lots to divide his clothing. 35 And the people stood by watching, but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" 36 The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine 37 and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" 38 There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

About the Music

The hymn "Come, Christians, Join to Sing" is set to the tune Madrid. The text was written by Christian Henry Batemen (1813-1899), who was ordained into the Church of England after serving as a Congregational minister, which followed his beginnings in the Moravian Church. The original text was "Come, Children, Join to Sing" but was later changed for use in the Presbyterian hymnal to include all ages. The first stanza begins with an exhortation to sing praises to the Lord. The second stanza reassures us that Christ the King is our "guide and friend," giving us reason to sing his praises. The third stanza assures us that we do not need to fear death but that on the "blissful shore" we shall sing his praises forevermore.

Today's anthem "At the Name of Jesus" is a glorious arrangement of the hymn tune written by Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958), a well-known and prolific English composer. Throughout his life Vaughan Williams sought to be of service to his fellow citizens and believed in making music as available as possible to everybody. He composed many new hymn tunes for the Church. The text emphasizes humility, but also has regal overtones - a great combination for the Christ the King Sunday - calling attention to the servant-king tradition.
