New Equipment



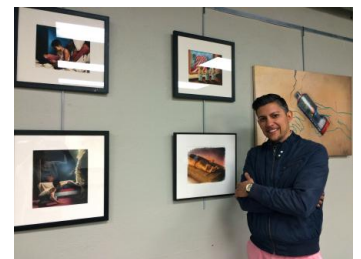
