## Learn to Homebrew Day on tap at Longneck Brew House

**STUART** — It's never been a better time to be a homebrewer. For anyone who loves beer and has never tried homebrewing before, it's really easy to get started.

Longneck Brew House and the Treasure Coast Brewmasters are hosting the American Homebrewers Association's Learn to Homebrew Day event on Saturday, Nov. 5 from 12:30 to 4 p.m. This free event is organized by the AHA.

Learn to Homebrew Day is an opportunity for homebrewers to draft their non-brewer friends and family to learn how to make beer at home. Longneck Brew House, at 950 S.E. Indian St., Stuart will be supporting the event for the third year in a row. Longneck Brew House, a brew-on-premise facility, is also a local homebrew supply shop and offers everything needed to get started. Longneck offers several of their own beers, as well as several guest taps and pub food.

"Homebrewing is a lifelong hobby that inspires creativity, comradery and

community," said Gary Glass, director of the American Homebrewers Association. "These qualities are on full display during AHA Learn to Homebrew Day, as veteran and rookie homebrewers come together to educate and celebrate."

The Treasure Coast Brewmasters, a local AHA-sanctioned homebrew club, will be on the porch sharing the basics of the hobby by brewing a batch of beer.

"You won't find a better group of people to teach you the art of making beer," said Barbara Faehnle, vice president of Treasure Coast Brewmasters. "Or a group more willing to help you drink it! ## Dixie Highway arch ready for Blue Star Memorial Marker

The Blue Star committee of the Jensen Beach Garden Club is busy preparing the historic arch between Jensen Beach and Stuart on Dixie Highway for the Nov. 11 dedication ceremony of the Blue Star Memorial Marker.

The dedication ceremony will take place on Nov. 11 at 2 p.m. in front of the Log Cabin in Langford Park. The public is urged to attend this patriotic and free event.

The name commemorates the blue star in the center of the white service flags which were first used during World War I. Usually they were placed in the windows

or on the front of the homes to denote a member of the family was serving in the nation's armed forces.

The niche on the south side of the arch will hold the marker. Dixie Highway will become part of a statewide system of Blue Star Memorial By-way Markers. U.S. 1 became the first Blue Star Memorial Highway in Florida in 1950. These highway markers are a tribute to the men and women who have or are now serving in the armed forces of the United States.
