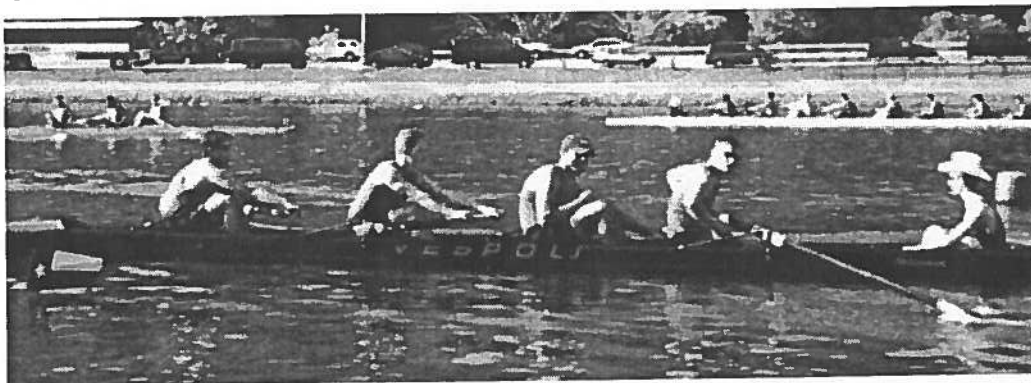

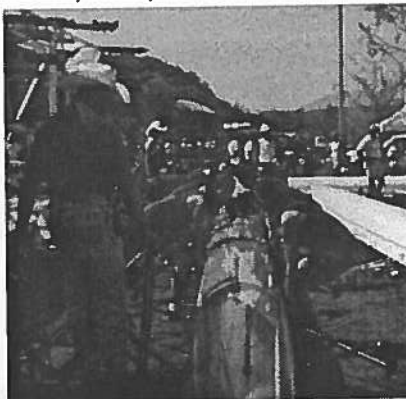

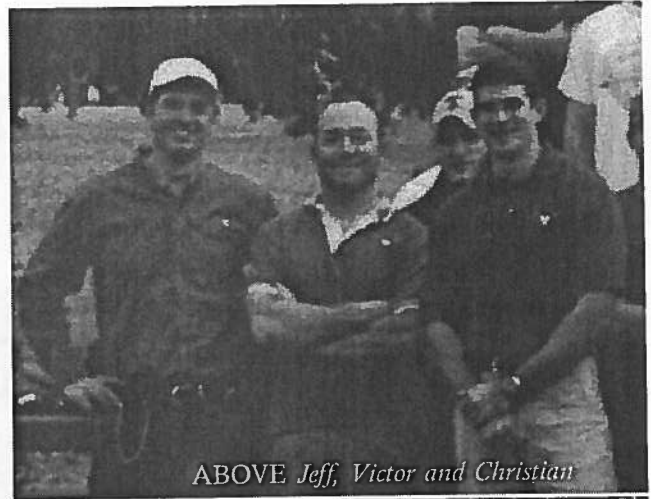

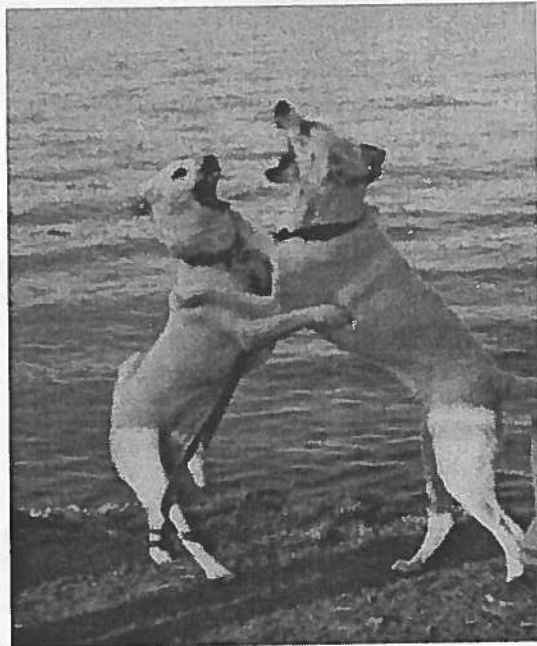


The Coaches (& the dogs)

What's even better is that Jeff has given Texas Crew the direction and continuity it deserves. I am glad to see the progression that crew has transitioned into a rising southern power. I hope to see this continue as we will become a powerful Club Program.

Major/minor: Psych major, Spanish minor.

When did you started rowing? spring 97 or 98. not really sure. three varsity years and a novice semester.

Your novice season: dismal. touched the oar maybe 5 times. no intentions of ever rowing again, but I ran into woody *et al* in the west mall recruiting. they told me practice was the next day and asked if I had a ride.

What you like about the people in crew? I like the attitude of the majority (99.9%) of the team. competitive camaraderie . . . even the people you don't get along with, eventually you love.

A recap of your 2000-2001 season. miracle 8 at head of the hooch, fall 2000. I was excited with the spring semester because of the potential for such a high level of competition . . . nationally with the light eight. we had a bit of a learning experience at the crew classic as we came in 2nd, when we should have won the race. no regrets though. SIRAs was disappointing as hell. we gave the win away. I'm looking forward to Avaya nationals and hope we pull together as a boat and row a strong, focused race.

If you're a multiple year rower, highlights of your achievement. started in Woody's class of rowers. last of the old school chaps who were here consistently these last three to four years. I feel partly responsible for where the team is today . . . we were all devoted to building a competitive program. in many ways, we succeeded. placed 2nd and 3rd at the hooch on different years placed 2nd twice at Midwest sprints '99 and '00. Qualified for Champions twice in a row only to get denied by the red tape of the UT system both times. placed 2nd at crew classic '01 and a very disappointing 2nd at SIRA '01. hope for a gold at Avaya nationals on the 13th. also co-founded the crew all stars with Blackwood. an interesting experience for all.

Most memorable race/worst race: worst race was SIRA '01, by far. most memorable race was Midwest sprints 1999. rag tag crew of 7 varsity lightweights and one novice chump (who was that? :) had to place in the top two to qualify for champion nationals. it was Nathan Colunga's last spring/sprint race. (earlier that year at SIRA we had been beaten out of the finals by 1/100th of a second, literally a coin flip finish in the fastest heat of the day.) we were down the whole race and pulled in out in the finished--Focus and faith in each other. we had two asthmatics in the boat, one with an 2k split close to my 40 minute split time. qualified for nationals and embraced each other on the dock, uni-suits only with our hard fought silver medals. it was beautiful.

Guess I do that to Gus (cannonball) now, so it balances out. I love Jeff, wish I had pulled harder everyday for him. :). guess everybody does. cant stress how important he has been for this team.

How has crew changed your life...did it? cost me many hours of sleep. fucking hell, and thousands of dollars. my vo2 max increased from 55 to 67. and my girlfriend I met through crew. shit . . . so much to say. beyond the obvious, I am ready to face the world- what can anyone throw at me that's worse than a 2k race with a gay Asian yelling at me while I'm blacking out? or should I ask, what's better? life looks bland, I'm ready to fuck it up and take mad advantage of every second. to hell with the mediocre and average. they are there for me to walk down . . . in two.

Kind and compassionate, made me want to row harder and put in the time to improve my fitness and technique. he was always supportive and respectful of his team mates. Major/minor: Majors- Bachelor of Arts in Biology and Spanish

Age/hometown/high school/birth town/state: Age- 23; Hometown- Brownsville; High school- St. Stephen's in Austin

When did you start rowing: Fall 2000

What do you like about the people in crew: I have never met a more devoted/ hard working group of people. Everyone has their personal reasons and motivations for being in Crew, but they are united by a common goal: to win come race day. I have come to know a lot of incredible people through Crew who I hope to carry with me throughout my life

A recap of your 2000-2001 season: Pumpkinhead- 2nd; Rice Invitational- 1st; Heart of Texas- 2nd; SIRAs- 2nd; Big XII Championship- 1st in the lightweight 4+, 3rd in the open 8+

Most memorable race/worst race: Our lightweight four's win at the Big 12 Championship would have to be my most memorable (from my vast repertoire) race. We were initially supposed to race at 1:45 in the afternoon, but due to wind conditions (you could actually see white caps) it was postponed to 5:45pm. When we finally did get on the water, we were there for an hour and a half before we were called over to the start. At the start Pilar and Nicole (yes, the coxswain) tried to keep us on our point by sculling, but due to the wind (it had not improved) it was nearly impossible. After about ten minutes of attempting to straighten out the boat and a lot of frustration, the official had the launch come over and help us. Winning that race was extremely rewarding, we knew that the other crews probably discounted our capabilities and we were ready to show them up.

The Freshmen Novice B race at the Hooch had to be one of the most disappointing rows/ races of my novice year. Our warm-up to the start was without mishap (especially for a novice boat), but disaster was awaiting us. As we were paddling up to the start, building pressure, two people caught crabs and we came to a complete stop. Well, that was definitely not irremediable; we managed to make it up to full pressure at the start, even though we were shaken. The calamitous events that took us out of the race occurred at about 2500m when my seat came off the slide and then again at 4000m when Tina's came off. We both managed to put them back on (Tina quicker than me) and we finished the race, but it took us out of contention.

What do you think about your coach: Christian is one of the most devoted coaches I have ever met. Even though we were definitely what you would call diamonds in the rough, he always believed in us, which made such a difference. Because it was his first year coaching and our first year rowing, it was a mutual learning experience and I believe a little more special. I will never forget Christian's quotes in between our erg pieces or his motivational speeches before races. I will always remember his infinite patience and sincere caring for our team as well as his passion for rowing.

Crew has taught me to surpass the limitations imposed by my mind on my capabilities. I have left behind a lot of haunting fears and uncertainties, which have plagued me. Of course, I still have insecurities, but crew has given me a tool in which to overcome them.

After graduation, I'm retaking the MCAT and applying for medical school this summer. I will be interviewing in the fall and will find out in January (cross your fingers and toes for me). In the meantime, I am going to be working as a paramedic's assistant or at the Blood and Tissue Center.

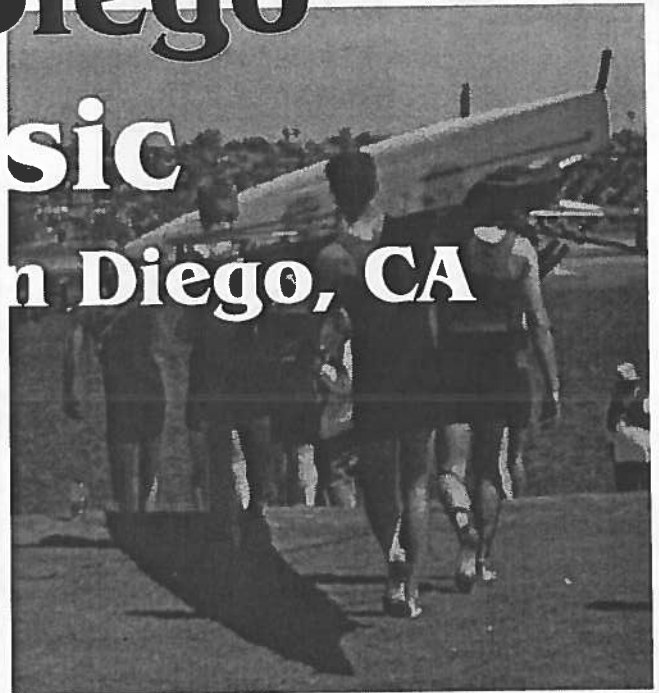

USC escapes sinking shell after second place in heat

Bad weather halts Crew Classic races

They had crossed the line in second place, securing their spot in the final.

At that point, it occurred to the women in the USC junior varsity shell that perhaps their focus should shift to personal safety.

April Hudlett, in the bow seat and up to her waist in water by that time, stood and yelled: "We're sinking!"

As race officials and a watercraft full of Navy SEALs converged on the buoys just beyond the finish line at the Crew Classic yesterday morning, the Trojans boat did indeed submerge.

"I hope everyone can swim," one Trojans yelled as the entire crew bailed into chilly Mission Bay.

The ensuing rescue of the USC rowers and salvaging of their shell were the last actions at Crown Point for almost six hours yesterday as rain and wind whipped the bay into a stew of whitecaps.

"It's completely a safety issue," chief referee John Walker said shortly after the 10:10 a.m. decision to halt racing.

"When boats start filling up with water," mused Washington coach Bob Ernst, "that's bad."

Said Trojans coach George Jenkins: "You don't want somebody getting killed out there." Two women rowers from

Notre Dame were treated as a precaution for possible hypothermia. But no other injuries were reported, and the damage done by the weather should be negligible by the time the regatta is finished this afternoon.

Just 30 of the scheduled 54 races were run yesterday, as racing did not resume until shortly after 4 p.m. But today's schedule will be extended, allowing all but seven of the originally scheduled races to be completed.

As part of the revamped timetable, the elite collegiate finals — the women's Jessop Whittier Cup and the men's Copley Cup — will go off 20 minutes later than planned, at 2:20 p.m. and 2:40 p.m., respectively.

As expected, Cal and Washington were the top two qualifiers for the Copley Cup. Washington and USC won their qualifying heats for the Jessop Whittier Cup.

But perhaps no crew will cherish its spot in its divisional final more than USC's JV women, whose shell took on water from high swells in the second half of the 2,000-meter course.

"I honestly think the only thing on everyone's mind was making sure we qualified for the finals, as perverted as that sounds," said USC coxswain Melissa Zimel. "Once we knew we were at the finish line, then it was like, 'OK, let's get out of here.'"

A few hours earlier, in water and weather that were already starting to drift toward nasty, qualifying for the Copley Cup

was stalled. After top-ranked Cal outdistanced second-place Penn by a boat length in the first qualifier, Wisconsin got off to a speedy start in its heat 300 meters into the course, only to run into a buoy that had snapped free from its anchor in the choppy water.

The Badgers, who led Washington by a half-length, immediately stopped rowing and officials ordered all the boats back to the line for a restart.

Washington, ranked fourth in the US Rowing Coaches pre-season poll, won the second try, with Wisconsin three-quarters of a boat behind in second.

"That is hard," said Badgers captain Alan Geweck. "But we obviously had something left." Cal will start the final in the advantageous first lane, which is closest to shore and thus has the smoothest water. Washington will start in Lane 2, Penn, Wisconsin, Yale and Oregon State also qualified for the Copley Cup final.

While a young Wisconsin team served notice with its resiliency, everyone will be watching Cal and its shell full of international standouts. The Bears have five Olympians on their varsity eights squad.

"They are good," Calder said. "They've got a lot of stars in their boat. But like anything in life, you can't line up thinking you're going to lose... We meet them four times between now and the national championships. It will be good if we can get a feel for them and keep on chipping away."

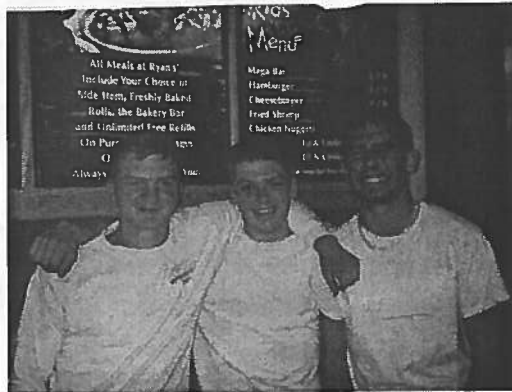

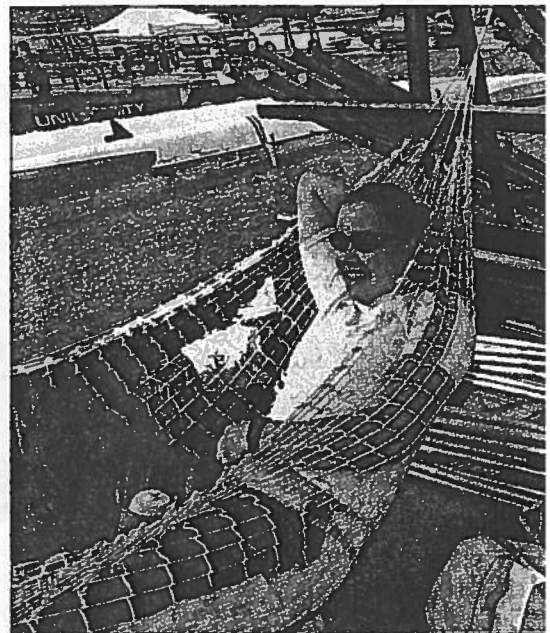

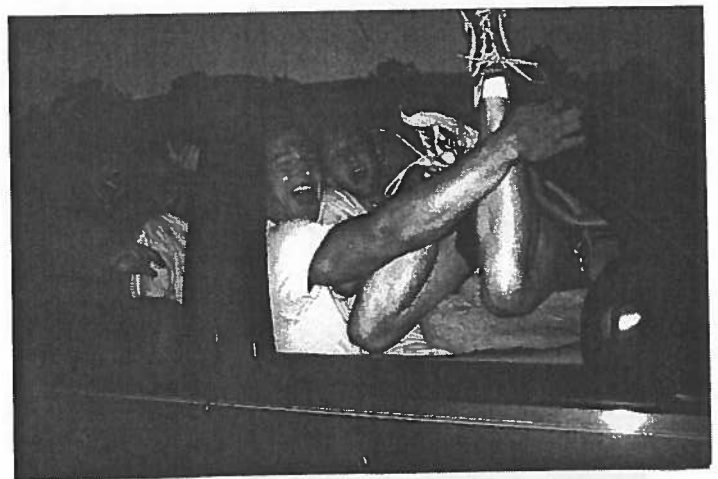
Spring Break 2001
