SUNDAY, OCTOBER 26TH - Departure from your chosen gateway city. OVERNIGHT: PLANE

MONDAY, OCTOBER 27TH - Your arrival in Ljubljana, Slovenia will be met for the transfer to our central hotel. The rest of the day is free to unpack, relax, and begin exploring the neighborhood. A welcome dinner is included at the hotel this evening. (D) OVERNIGHT: LJUBLJANA

Tuesday, October 28TH - A morning walking tour of Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia, with a local guide takes us behind the scenes of the ancient capital and includes visits to Ljubljana Castle, Dragon Bridge, and the Metelkova Art Centre. The rest of the afternoon and evening are free. (B) Overnight: Ljubljana

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 29TH - This morning, we take a day trip to the town of Bled which is located on the shores of an emerald green glacial lake that has been sacred to the local inhabitants for millennia. We will visit Bled Castle or Blejski Grad in Slovene, the oldest Castle in Slovenia, perched atop a cliff towering 130 metres above Lake Bled. We will have time for lunch in town and personal exploration of the area before a short drive brings us back to our hotel in Ljubljana for a free evening. (B) OVERNIGHT: LJUBLJANA

Thursday, October 30TH - Today we cross the border with Italy at Trieste. We'll make a brief stop here with time for lunch before we drive south, crossing the border into Croatia and arriving at the town of Opatija. Originally a quiet fishing village, Opatija became popular in the 19th century as a winter retreat for the nobility of the Austro-Hungarian empire and their magnificent villas remain. Upon arrival at our hotel, there will be time to settle in before we regroup for dinner. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: OPATIJA

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 31st - Our tour today takes us through the heart of the Istrian Peninsula. We'll stop first at Porec, where we visit the Basilica of Euphrasias containing some of the most wonderful mosaics in the world—easily the equal of those at Ravenna. We continue south down the coast to Rovinj to wander the seafront, stop for lunch and perhaps sample the local truffles for which the region is famous. We continue along the coast to visit the wonderfully preserved Roman Amphitheater in Pula before returning to Opatija where you will have a free evening to sample a local restaurant. (B) OVERNIGHT: OPATIJA



SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 1ST - Leaving Opatija, we continue our journey south, stopping along the way at Plitvice Lakes National Park, Croatia's largest national park covering almost 30,000 hectare. Interconnected by many waterfalls and watercourses above and below ground, the lakes are grouped into the upper and lower lakes. The former are formed on dolomites, with mild relief, not so steep shores and enclosed by thick forests, whereas the latter, smaller and shallower, are situated in limestone canyon with partially steep shores. There will plenty of time for exploring the park, along with lunch at a nearby restaurant before we make our way to our hotel in Split where dinner awaits us. **(B, L, D) OVERNIGHT: SPLIT**



SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 2ND - A morning excursion to Krka National Park, situated along the Krka River. Known for it's series of 7 waterfalls—to the south, Skradinski Buk waterfall is flanked by traditional watermills, and to the north, a nature trail passes another striking cascade, Roški Slap, and the Krka Monastery, built above ancient Roman catacombs. Continuing on, we'll stop in Trogir—a small island connected to the mainland and the island of Čiovo by bridges—for lunch and exploration of its preserved old town, known for its mix of Renaissance, baroque and Romanesque buildings. We return to Split for a free evening. **(B) OVERNIGHT: SPLIT**

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 3RD - This morning, discover the city of Split on a sightseeing tour with a local guide. The historic city center lies within the walls of the Palace of Diocletian, built for his retirement between 295—305 AD, before the city itself was founded. Your afternoon and evening are free to wander the harbor front or explore the many shops and market stalls. **(B) OVERNIGHT: SPLIT**

Tuesday, November 4TH - Today we leave the city of Split, driving south along the Dalmatian Coast. On the way we'll detour briefly inland crossing the border into Bosnia-Herzegovina to visit the town of Mostar. We'll pass by the world-famous Marian shrine at Medjugorje and stop briefly in Metkovic to visit the remains of the ancient Roman city of Narona. We'll continue to our hotel in Dubrovnik where dinner awaits us. (B, D) Overnight: Dubrovnik

Wednesday, November 5TH - A full-day excursion to Montenegro, nestled between the Adriatic's Gulf of Kotor and surrounding mountains. Our first stop will be Perast, where we will visit the island church. Our next stop will be the medieval-walled city of Kotor—a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Explore the narrow streets, cathedrals, and historic squares that served as important commercial and artistic centers in the Middle Ages. There will be time for lunch before we return to Dubrovnik and a free evening to sample a local restaurant. (B) Overnight: Dubrovnik

Thursday, November 6TH - After a leisurely start to the day, a local guide will introduce you to Dubrovnik on a walking tour of the city. Explore ancient city walls, the old town—a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and the harbor. You will have ample time to explore and shop on your own before we gather tonight for a farewell dinner. (B, D) OVERNIGHT: DUBROVNIK

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 7TH - Morning transfer to Dubrovnik Airport for returning flights to the USA. (B)
