Niagalen is a 9th grader with Mali Rising. Her favorite subjects are chemistry and physics, and she would like to ultimately become a doctor.

However, Niagalen is afraid she'll be married before she can achieve her dreams. In Mali, 15 percent of girls are married before their fifteenth birthday and 50 percent are married by eighteen.

Niagalen says: "I'm scared of being married before finishing my studies. For my hand I would like to meet one who knows the values a woman educated for to let me to continue my studies."

Mali Rising helps keep girls like Niagalen. We provide special support & safe, girl-friendly schools that allow girls to grow up and learn.



By nearly every measure today Mali is one of the poorest countries in the world.

Education allows kids to help themselves, & help Mali.



For every year of secondary education, future earnings increase by 10 to 20%.



For every additional year of school the average citizen has, GDP increases by 0.37%.



With just a 10% increase in a country's middle school enrollment, the risk of war decreases by 3%.



If all women had a secondary education, estimates are there would be 49% fewer infant and child deaths.

We use a model of partnership with remote villages.



In partnership with local villages, we have built 20 successful schools.



Before Mali Rising construction, our students walked about 3-5 miles on average to reach a school.



Our graduation rate is approximately 1.5x the national average.
