(Co-)Presidents' Message

Dear Members:



We have OUR glass all packed up and ready for CONVENTION! DO YOU? If you have glass to sell or trade and are driving, bring it. If you are flying, bring a list and/or pictures so you can still "make deals"! Bill Crowl will only be at the convention until Friday evening, so don't miss the opportunity of spending a little money... COME EARLY!

For those of you who haven't been to a SGS Convention before, here is what we do. We take stretch glass for sale/trade if we have it, we take some for display and if we have pieces we can't identify, we bring those too. But best of all, we talk with a whole lot of people who share our love of STRETCH GLASS.

Those of you who decided not to order this year's Commemorative are really going to be disappointed! Jim Steinbach and Renée were on hand at the Fenton Art Glass Co. when production began on these beautiful pieces of stretch. They shot videotape and stills of the process, which turned out to be even more unique this year than in previous years. The original mold

for the server was found just last year and considerable time was given to the task of coming up with a snap that could be used without interfering with the dolphin-shaped handle. Low and behold, but they ran across the old original snap, too! It isn't like any of the snaps used today, it's actually two solid pieces of metal with the shape of half of the dolphin molded inside each piece so, when opened, it fits over the server's handle exactly. Of course, having found the original mold and snap didn't exactly mean that the rest was.... a SNAP!

"This is the first time in 70 years we've produced this shape!", Frank Fenton said. Do you realize that's longer than most of us have even been around! And, what do you think generally happens when you try something that you've never done before? RIGHT, you end up trying it several times before you figure out what works best! Such was the case with this server. Everyone involved ended up scratching their heads at one time or another from Fenton, himself, on down to the job foreman and the finisher.

As we sit here writing this, we do not know if the factory has come up with the solutions to the

difficulties they were having and are going to be able to meet our deadline for the Convention. They may actually come back to us and say that they need more time to work out the problems. If it comes to this, those of you who placed an order will be notified and given the option of accepting an alternate piece or getting a refund. That would certainly simplify things for selecting the piece for the 1999, SGS 25th Anniversary Convention – taa daa – how about a Dolphin-handled Server in RED!?

We want to change the topic now to other matters. Last newsletter, we spent considerable time moaning about the lack of participation and camaraderie in the SGS. Well, we are happy to report that many of you took our comments to heart and took action! We've had phone calls, letters and e-mails from all over. A great big THANK YOU goes to Phil and Mary Barber out in Iowa for that "Get Acquainted" phone call; Marceline Kile and Bud Ashmore, both in Indiana for taking the time to send us letters; Helen Jones for not only sending us an e-mail message, but also offering assistance if/where needed. We also thank the Crawfords—Charles and Carol—(Kansas) for calling us a couple of times. Charles is really attracted to that RED Imperial "Jewels" and Carol likes ALL stretch. (We know, we've seen that AOL address all over eBay! LOL) We also heard from Augusta Keith, our "neighbor" here in central Ohio, who offered to help with the '99 Convention, Berry Wiggins sent us a note saying he wasn't going to make it to the Chicago meeting, but will be on hand in

Marietta. Also, a special THANKS goes to Darlene Johnson of Phillipsburg, Kansas for taking the time to really get to know us--first by phone, then e-mail—and for sharing information and enthusiasm with us. We look forward to her comments on a DAILY basis!

Speaking of eBay (above), we have been quite successful, as have many of the others who have used this on-line auction service. Of course, if we were smart, we'd keep our mouths shut so we don't have any more competition than we already have! But noooo, now, in addition to the Carnival Glass collectors bidding against us for OUR stretch glass, SGS members will be coming out of the woodwork to bid against us. Well, we have to keep the right perspective and keep the competition on a friendly level (as long as we get the highest bid)!

Some of the items we've found on eBay have been a pair of Diamond Cobalt Blue Crackle/Stretch Candlesticks, a large Fenton Persian Pearl three-footed and crimped Fruit Bowl (#603), a Royal Purple "Tree-of-Life" cupped bowl of Northwood's and a Jade Blue bowl and black base of Northwood's. That isn't to say that we haven't made a few mistakes!

If any of you are considering trying eBay out, or even if you have already bid on a few items, PLEASE read all instructions, check on all seller "feed-back" and most of all, ask the seller even those questions you may believe are obvious. Don't make assumptions. You know what happens when you assume something--it makes an ASS of U and ME!
