OKLAHOMA CITY, Oct. 17.—Oklahoma today is emerging from its most disastrous flood in the North Canadian river region to its ordinarily narrow banks, leaving a thousand persons homeless, property damaged estimated at \$2,500,000, railroad and highway service paralyzed and public utility services curtailed.
