

Stretchy, Simple, 5 Stone Bracelet



7" bracelet

stone beads measure 1" long, .75" wide

It was hard to ignore these beads as I was shopping. The colors are beautiful, their surface is sleek and the slim price was very attractive. I don't know if they are true Jasper Stone but they have the same qualities as the ones in "[Vicky's Jasper Stone](#)" bracelet. I used two strands of stretch cord here to insure the weight of the stones won't cause this bracelet to sag. This is an ideal project if you're a novice or an expert short on time. Assemble it in less than 30 minutes.

DIRECTIONS

Step 1 - Cut a strand of stretchy cord to measure 24".



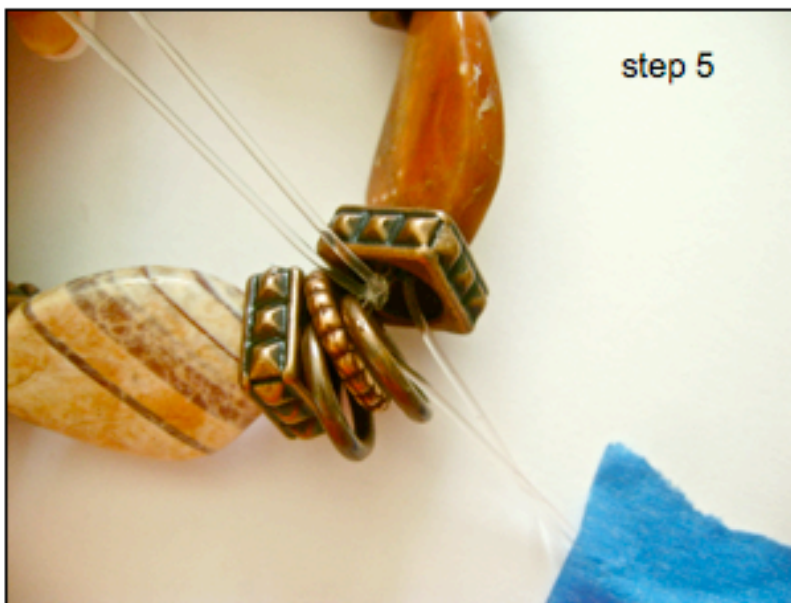
This photo shows the order of the seven beads in a set for stringing.
Before you begin, add a square bead in front of the first stone in the set.



Pass the cord through all the beads.
When you reach the end, slip on a stop
bead and pass the cord back through the
beads.



The two ends of the bracelet should now
look like this.



Pull on the stop bead until you have two same length cords on both ends of the bracelet. Cut the cord and remove the stop bead. Tie two matching cords into a triple knot. You may have to anchor down the other two cords with tape to keep them out of the way. Dot the knot with glue. When dry, trim the ends. Do the same with the last two cords. When wearing, the knots will be hidden in the dip in the square bead.

Tip

If you need a longer bracelet, add more of the copper beads to each set.
