## ABOUT

This 3.5 day symposium, held at Columbine High School in Littleton, Colorado, examines lessons learned from traumatic events and reveals new, preemptive school safety measures growing in multiple realms. The Symposium is designed to provide a number of takeaways that districts, departments and agencies can implement immediately.

## Audience

Law enforcement, school personnel, victim advocates, mental health professionals, emergency and risk management staff, school safety teams and all first responders.

## Speakers

Presenters include school administrators, law enforcement, criminal justice and school security administrators who have been involved in the response and recovery to school violence and other traumatic events.

## 2017 FOCUS

### The Lifecycle of a Crisis

Over the course of the Symposium, we'll examine the components of a crisis or trauma. This logical timeline will include information on what to do and how to do it.

## Sunday Opening Presentation

This will not be made public due to the sensitive nature of the incident. This presentation will be a point/counterpoint debrief of a high profile incident from the perspective of SWAT entry team and school personnel.

Standard Reunification Method Advanced Trainer Workshop. This is the SRP/SRM Basic Seminar, plus a tabletop exercise and practical exercise are conducted. Participants are provided the tools to conduct these exercises.
