August 15 is the celebration of the Assumption into Heaven of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is typically a holy day of obligation, unless August 15 falls on a Saturday or Monday it is not obligatory. Though it is not obligatory to attend Mass this year on the Assumption, I recommend that you take the opportunity to go to Mass to praise God for the gift of Mary. There will be Mass times throughout the day at various parishes. I will host the regular Monday 7:15am Mass at Blessed Sacrament. SOLEMNITY of the ASSUMPTION of MARY – August 15th

The Solemnity of the Assumption Mary in Heaven is August 15th. This year the feast falls on a Monday and is NOT considered a Holy Day of Obligation. The Mass on Monday morning @ 7:15 AM will be the only offering for BSP/RNP. Know that on November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever-Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory."

de gustibus non disputandum est

Many of us have strong opinions about liturgy. We like/dislike the music, preaching, décor, or intercessions and aren't afraid to ask for changes. When RNP was immersed in renovation (which was completed in 2010), parishioners often commented on whether they liked or disliked our choices for carpeting, paint, or whatever. Fr. Mark was fond of responding with "de gustibus non disputandum est," which translates as, "in matters of taste, there can be no rational argument." Fr. Mark wanted all of us to understand that one person's taste wasn't necessarily better than another's, and that opinions (especially those regarding décor) were better shared in organized discussions. HOW DIFFERENT ARE WE?

This weekend, Father Billy Dodge is giving parishioners from both Blessed Sacrament and Roncalli Newman parishes the opportunity to ask questions about what is feeling more and more like a merger. Even though I have been immersed in this, I'm still questioning why two such distinctly different parishes were considered a match when the Diocesan Pastoral Plan was adopted several years ago. Yes, I continue to have questions about the decision while sorting them out against the broader backdrop of Catholic worship.

My husband, Mike, and I are experienced travelers which means we've attended Mass throughout the United States and abroad. One of the blessings of being Catholic is that the liturgy is intact, so that even if the music, preaching, language, and people change, we can experience familiar and meaningful liturgical prayer. Catholic churches in the U.S. tend to be more "traditional," "ceremonial," "contemporary," or even "folksy." We don't veer that far from our European counterparts who dress their clergy in expensive chasubles and worship in glorious spaces adorned with stained glass.

Attending Mass in Zambia was a completely different experience. Visiting my daughter, Madeline (who served in the Peace Corps from 2016-2018), opened my eyes to the depth and breadth of global Catholic worship. Here is an article of my experience St. Theresa of the Little Flower for the Solemnity of the Epiphany in Livingstone, Zambia in 2018.

FEAST of EPIPHANY in LIVINGSTONE, ZAMBIA 2018

Today was the Solemnity of the Epiphany, which we celebrated at St. Theresa of the Little Flower, a Catholic Church in Livingstone, Zambia. This was a parish that resembled home because they had a building, priest, and some resources – a far cry from the church in Madeline's village. It was quite the celebration – a choir of high school kids sang, while elementary-aged girls danced to the music. Ah, the music! They sang loud and long, often accompanying their singing with dancing. The processional included the dancers, several altar boys, liturgical ministers, the deacon, and priest. The choir sang and opening hymn, but the whole congregation erupted during the Gloria. People were ululating randomly and everyone in the congregation was swaying/dancing, even if they weren't singing. Preparation of the Gifts was especially cool because people brought their gifts forward rather than drop money in a basket. They danced their "change" up and back to their seats, followed by people who brought of material goods – flour, sugar, eggs, etc. The sermon lasted a full 45 minutes (which was long and impassioned) but the fantastic music brought everyone back into the spirit of the liturgy. I went up to the balcony during the second collection so that I could get a video of the girls dancing and all the people swaying. It was an uplifting and glorious 2 ½ hours!
