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


Climate maps show what the weather of a place is like over a period of time. They show the patterns of weather, such as hot, dry summers or cold, wet winters. This map shows the many different climate zones of Europe, which has great variety in spite of the continent's small size.



DID YOU KNOW?

A current of warm water in the Atlantic Ocean called the North Atlantic Drift helps to moderate the climate of much of Europe. This warming current explains why the weather in London, England, is much more mild than that in Calgary, Canada, even though these two cities are at about the same latitude.
