## **Heroin Awareness for Law Enforcement – Christopher Martin**

Christopher Martin currently serves as the Captain of the Brewer Police Department in Brewer, Maine. Captain Martin has been in law enforcement since 1993 and with the Brewer Police Department since 1994. During his tenure, Captain Martin has implemented programs in schools and public housing in an effort to combat a growing drug problem. He has specialized in the street level drug investigations and has served as investigator and supervisor in cases involving uniformed patrol interdiction, knock and talk, hotel/motel, use of cooperating individuals, controlled purchases, and preparation and execution of search warrants. Captain Martin has over 600 hours of specialized training in drug investigations. He specializes in teaching on the subjects of Pharmaceutical Robberies; Prevention and Response; Workplace Violence; Prevention and Response; Synthetic / Substituted Cathinones (Bath Salts); Heroin/Opiates; and Criminal Interdiction. He has instructed for police officers, schools, civic organizations, and community forums in Maine, New England, and throughout the continental United States. Captain Martin was a member of the Penobscot County Adult Drug Court Team and currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors for the Bangor Area Recovery Network, the Bangor area Substance Abuse Task Force/ Drug Free Communities, and the International Law Enforcement Association.

## **Law Enforcement on the Stand – Professor Caren Cambre**

Professor Caren Cambre is a career homicide prosecutor, an experienced law school professor, and the creator of LAW ENFORCEMENT ON THE STAND, a national law enforcement witness training program. She is licensed to practice law in New York, Louisiana and the District of Columbia. With more than 30 years of courtroom experience, and hundreds of jury trials she has worked extensively with law enforcement preparing and presenting their testimony throughout litigation. She has led the most serious cases, including numerous death penalty cases, to successful trial verdicts. In the Jefferson Parish Louisiana District Attorney's Office, she was a Felony Trial Supervisor and Special Prosecutor in charge of the high-profile cases that had intense media coverage. As part of the Kings County New York District Attorney's Office's specialized Homicide Bureau, she visited crime scenes, took video statements from homicide suspects at the precincts and handled Grand Jury presentations, in addition to trying many complex jury trials. She was assigned to the Career Criminal Unit of the New

Orleans District Attorney's Office in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, trying cases under the most difficult of circumstances. She has taught at law enforcement training academies in both Florida and Louisiana.

As an Adjunct Professor at both Tulane Law School in New Orleans and Golden Gate Law School in San Francisco, she taught Trial Advocacy, Advanced Trial Advocacy, Mock Trial, Trial Evidence & Advocacy, and Professional Responsibility. At Golden Gate Law School she created and taught a successful new course called Ethical Prosecutions. She has been a Mock Trial Judge and coached national mock trial teams. Professor Cambre has taught hundreds of lawyers how to question law enforcement witnesses. Recognizing that the answers given by witnesses are critical to successful trials, she identified a need to teach law enforcement officers to become effective and credible witnesses. Using both her extensive trial experience and her teaching experience she created LAW ENFORCEMENT ON THE STAND, a witness training program specifically designed for law enforcement. She has trained hundreds of officers across the country for both national and local agencies. Her program was recently highlighted by the National HIDTA Assistance Center News and has been endorsed by Sheriffs and Police Chiefs in several states. Evaluations from officers who have attended her training have said "this outstanding training is critically necessary and long overdue". Professor Cambre received her J.D. from Tulane Law School. She has a B.S. degree in Criminal Justice and is married to a law enforcement officer.

## **Pharmaceutical Drug Investigations – Frank Hornyak**

Frank Hornyak is an Associate Director of RxLELE (Law Enforcement Liaison and Education) for Purdue Pharma. Prior to joining Purdue Pharma in 2016, Mr. Hornyak served in federal narcotics law enforcement for 25 years as a Special Agent with the Drug Enforcement Administration. Most recently, he was assigned to DEA's Office of Diversion Control, Pharmaceutical Investigations Unit in Washington, D.C. In this capacity, Mr. Hornyak was tasked with coordination and strategy of all of the diversion investigations from several of DEA's busiest offices. Mr. Hornyak also served as the primary liaison with DEA's Office of Chief Counsel on registrant actions, namely Orders to Show Cause and Immediate Suspension Orders.

Prior to this assignment, Mr. Hornyak served in numerous positions within the DEA, including as a Special Agent in Newark, New Jersey, and New York City. In addition, Mr. Hornyak was assigned as an instructor in DEA's training academy, and as DEA's liaison in Cartagena, Colombia and Kabul, Afghanistan. In these foreign assignments Mr. Hornyak provided training to foreign law enforcement officials and was the primary narcotics liaison between the host country and the United States Department of State.

Mr. Hornyak is a member of the National Association of Drug Diversion Investigators (NADDI). He holds a Bachelor of Arts (BA) Degree in Economics from Rutgers University.
