

# A NOTE FROM THE CHAIR




This has been a big year for Theatre Republic: a year of sadness, replenishment, growth, and renewed focus on the company's medium- and long-term goals.

In November 2022, the brilliant Roz Hervey regretfully resigned from the board, and in December of that year, the much-loved chair of the company, Jamie Anderson, died suddenly. Both made an enormous contribution over their years of service. Roz remains a valued supporter, and Jamie is greatly missed.

It was an honour to be invited to join the board as chair, having spent four years on the board of Sydney's Griffin Theatre Company, and nine years on the board of State Theatre Company of SA. In obvious ways, the latter experience is more relevant to an Adelaide-based company, but in fact it is my time with Griffin that I lean on in this role, it being a small company with the most noble of theatrical ambitions: to present 100% new Australian work.

The company celebrated its fifth year of existence and Manda Flett, the company's indefatigable Company Manager, chose that milestone to depart the company to pursue the other in-demand professional and personal elements of her life. Manda's departure provided the company with the opportunity to restructure operations. The role of Company Manager was split into two new positions: Producer and Finance Officer. Stepping into the role of Producer is another theatre artist and administrator, Annabel Matheson, who has brought new focus and energy to the steerage of the company as artistic director Corey McMahon's chief operational partner, with the company's financial operations now managed by arts accountant Will Traeger.



We have also welcomed three new board members: Liz Gogler, Catherine Bauer, and Daniel Stirling-Brown. All three bring lots of new drive and determination to guide Theatre Republic toward its goals as an important stay (and stayer!) of South Australian theatre.

The company employed more artists than ever before; produced a major new commissioned work, *The Garden*; undertook a third-stage development of Anthony Nocera's new work of scale, *Log Boy*; presented an enhanced and very entertaining *Future:Present* which—aside from being a terrific night of raw theatre—represents our determination to be a nurturing developmental presence in the theatre of Adelaide; Corey is working tirelessly on new institutional and artistic partnerships and new works; and we are in the early stages of carefully developing our Reconciliation Action Plan, a crucial foundation for our ambitions as an inclusive company resident on beautiful Kaurna land.

We are extremely grateful for the support of our generous donors, the enthusiasm of a growing audience, the goodwill and encouragement of local artists, and—of course—the financial support of the Government of South Australia.

CHAIR OF THE BOARD



2023 was a mixture of celebration, achievements and challenges. We celebrated the company's 5th birthday; a significant milestone for a micro-organisation such as ours! To mark the occasion (and aid in our fundraising program), we created a featurette and invited Theatre Republic alumni to share their experience of working with the company. Our 2023 program focused solely on the presentation and development of new local writing. All three projects supported the work of local playwrights and provided vital employment opportunities to local artists and creatives. In 2023 we presented two major productions: Future:Present 2.0 at the Goodwood Theatre and The Garden at the Space Theatre, presented in association with the Adelaide Festival Centre. A last-minute addition to our program was undertaking the third stage development of Log Boy by Anthony Nocera, a new work of scale we have been developing for last couple of years. The development was made possible thanks to an out-of-round grant secured through Arts SA.

2023 saw the company continue to punch above its weight. Three projects for a small company such as ours, with a combined core staffing total of 0.6 FTE, was no small achievement. Support through the Program Support Grant enabled us to continue to extend our engagement with local artists and grow our artistic program. This resulted in a marked increase in the number of artists we employed across the year. In 2022 we provided employment opportunities to 17 people. In 2023, the company supported 32 artists, creatives, technical and stage management crew (an increase of 88%). These results illustrate just how far we have come from our humble beginnings, presenting our first production at the Bakehouse Theatre in 2018.

As noted in the Chair's Report, the year began with the company coming to terms with the sudden loss of Jamie Anderson, who served as Chair of the Board for 2 years. Jamie's passing was felt deeply within the company. In January 2023 we were incredibly fortunate to have Dr Terence Crawford step into the role of Chair. Terence has been a reassuring and decisive presence and his ascension to the role provided the catalyst needed to invite a number of new Directors to serve on the board.

With a new team and refreshed board there's a new energy and focus within the company. We have started work on the development of a First Nations' framework and Reconciliation Action Plan, we have expanded our engagement with local artists, and we continue to expand our donor base to diversify the company's income streams. This expansion will enable us to provide more opportunities for local theatre makers into the future.

Our sincere thanks and gratitude to our small band of committed donors and to the team at Arts SA who continue to provide support and guidance to the company.

# FUTURE: PRESENT 2.0.

2023 kicked off with the return of *Future:Present*, our new writing incubator project. The inaugural season took place in 2021. *Future:Present 2.0* assembled a team of 18 playwrights, directors, actors and creatives, production and stage managers to present four new short plays, written and staged in response to a compelling topic or theme, relevant to the times we are living in.

In 2023 Future: Present challenged the team to rapidly create their plays in response to the theme of democracy.

The four plays presented were:

The 2023 season of *Future:Present* was a great success. It is a bold experiment that challenges playwrights, actors, directors and creatives to draw on their skills and talent to produce four new local plays, in record time; plays that are edgy, raw, thought-provoking and entertaining. We once again enjoyed a strong response at the box office, beating our target, and playing to a very enthusiastic and boisterous audience.



Future: Present 2.0 took place over two weeks from 26 June to 29 June 2023 (writing) and 10 July to 14 July 2023 (rehearsal and presentation), with rehearsals and performance taking place at the Goodwood Theatre and Studios.



Future:Present 2.0 was followed by the world premiere of The Garden written by Emily Steel. The play was commissioned, developed and produced across the latter half of 2022 and across 2023. Following the creative and critical success of How Not To Make It In America, Emily's first commission for Theatre Republic in 2021, it was agreed that a new play, tapping into some of the most topical issues facing the planet would be commissioned for production in 2023.

Based on Emily's short play written for *Future:Present 1.0*, The Garden was an examination of inequality, climate change and poverty, explored using the metaphor of a community garden.





The Garden, presented in the Space Theatre, was a creative success with all of the elements – direction, acting, set and lighting design, composition – coming together to create a successfully rendered and professional production. The Garden told an important story and explored some potent and relevant themes. The production represented everything that Theatre Republic is about: working with local artists to create new, politically charged, Australian plays that engage with the conversations we are having about our world – right now.

Rehearsals for *The Garden* took place from 11 September to 6 October 2023 with bump-in and performance at the Space Theatre from 9 October to 14 October 2023.



# LOG BOY DEVELOPMENT.

In between Future:Present 2.0 and The Garden, we undertook the third stage development of Log Boy by Anthony Nocera. Log Boy is a new theatrical work of scale that is bold, formally ambitious and highly theatrical. Theatre Republic has been developing the play with Anthony over the last 2 years. Log Boy explores the inter-generational tension between gay men arising from the AIDS crisis, bringing a cast of queer characters to the stage to explore the theme of gay shame and its relationship to the AIDS epidemic which - after almost 40 years - continues to haunt the generation of gay men who survived it. Anthony Nocera is one of South Australia's most exciting new voices. His writing is whip- smart, combining a knack for writing clever, witty dialogue with an uncanny insight into what makes us humans tick.

The development for *Log Boy* took place from 14 to 18 August 2023.



#### THEATRE REPUBLIC IS A PLAYWRIGHT'S THEATRE COMPANY.

#### WE TAKE OUR INSPIRATION FROM THE WRITER'S WORDS.

Our new writing development program is designed to develop and ultimately produce one new local play every two years. This timeline means we can devote the right amount of time to nurturing the creation of a new play and to supporting the playwright to do their best work.

Theatre Republic does not accept unsolicited submissions. Instead, our approach starts with a conversation and with one simple question:

### What would you like to write about?

We're committed to empowering the writer, so they tell the story they want to tell.

Our new writing program operates across two strands:

- Commissioning a playwright to write a new, full-length play
- Our new writing incubator project, Future:Present, that provides playwrights with the opportunity to write a new short play, tested in the rehearsal room and on-stage in front of a live audience. Future:Present is designed to be a gateway for further development of selected works into a full-length play.

Since 2018, we have developed and presented two new full length plays and have seen the writing and presentation of eight new short plays as part of *Future:Present*, with two of the short plays selected for development into full-scale works.



#### COLLEGIALITY

#### BY MATT CROOK

Local actor, director and theatre maker, Matt Crook has created a disturbing new play that exposes the dark underbelly of elite private boy's schools.

Collegiality examines the relationship between class, entitlement, accountability and power.



## LOG BOY

#### BY ANTHONY NOCERA

Anthony Nocera's wickedly dark comedy explores the intergenerational tensions that exist between survivors of the AIDS epidemic and today's generation of care-free queer people. Log Boy is an epic work of scale that sees the past and present collide in a battle over who gets to own queer grief and shame.


