

ONE-TIME FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

DCAF

DCAF stands for Direct Client Assistance fund. It is a program that offers households access to assistance funds once per year. Funds are used for self-sufficiency needs such as school books, ID, car insurance, bus passes, and specific work supplies. Rental assistance is not offered through this program. Call the front desks Monday and 8:30 am to schedule an intake appt. Three appointments are scheduled a week and appointments are made on a first come, first served basis Monday mornings. For more information on this program call and ask to speak with the Case Manager of the day.

Elderly Assistance Fund

The Elderly Assistance Fund operates like the DCAF program, in that it provides financial assistance for self-sufficiency needs no more than one time a year per household. This program is targeted towards persons 60 years and older. Call and ask for the case manager of the day to see if appointments are available for this program.

HOMELESS PREVENTION & SHELTER DIVERSION

The Homeless Prevention and Shelter Diversion program will provide services to persons most at risk of homelessness before they become homeless or enter a community shelter. It is designed to decrease the overall number of persons becoming homeless in Yamhill County through short-term assistance: including financial assistance, case management, and resource connection through a County wide access point, the Homeless Prevention Hotline.

Basic Eligibility Requirements:

- At or below 30% Area Median Income
- An eviction notice indicating imminent eviction (within 7-14 days)
- No resources or support networks to prevent homelessness

CLIENT SERVICES

YCAP Client Services

Department



The Client Services Department at YCAP offers a variety of services and resources to the community including: one-time financial assistance, Transitional Living shelter placement, rental assistance programs, case management, and other supportive services.

SHELTER

YCAP operates three Shelters for homeless families and children. One in Newberg and two in McMinnville. The shelter is an opportunity for households experiencing homelessness to take steps towards obtaining safe and affordable housing. Therefore, weekly case management sessions, referrals resource connection, and other supportive services are provided to shelter families.

PROCEDURE

Households experiencing homelessness who would like to be placed in the shelter may be seen on a “walk-in” basis during office hours. Upon completion of an intake interview and signed releases, a criminal background check will be completed. When no immediate rooms are available, those seeking shelter will be placed on a waitlist and called for a shelter orientation and move-in when an appropriate room becomes available.

SUPPORTIVE SERVICES

Case management

Case Management services are provided to clients in YCAP programs. Case managers focus on self-



sufficiency and housing stability goals and provide a variety of resources including: resource connection, advocacy, and skill building. Aftercare is also provided to clients for 6 months following exit from a program. One-time case management services are also available on a “walk-in” basis.

Self-Sufficiency Lab

The Self-Sufficiency Lab is located at YCAP’s main office and is equipped with computers, printer, phones, and resource guides on self-sufficiency topics. It is open to the public. One-on-one assistance is available by appointment.

RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Housing

YCAP operates several housing programs to meet the diverse needs of those experiencing homelessness in Yamhill County. Length of rental assistance is tailored to the household’s need and varies by program.

Program	Target Population
Home Tenant Based Assistance	Low income, homeless households
Rural Oregon Leasing and Supportive Services (ROLS)	Homeless households working with Yamhill County Mental Health
Stabilization and Self-Reliance	Homeless households fleeing domestic violence
Supportive Services for Veteran Families	Homeless households containing a veteran
