Sanctuary Art:

John 1:14 was the meditation undergirding the 2016 Advent art installation. “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.”

The Incarnation (God coming in human flesh) was a journey of great transitions: from heavenly to earthly realm, from God who is Spirit to God joined with human form, from Creator to inhabitant of creation, from inseparable divine community to broken human community, from God unseen to God revealed, from Word to flesh. It is a breathtakingly unimaginable cross-cultural journey.

Hanging Installation: Word Incarnate

Artists: Sarah Hedges & Katie Pourcho

Statement: The installation visualizes the Word becoming flesh to dwell among us. Conceptual pages of Scripture evolve into paper clippings that allude to marrow and DNA. Blue acrylic book binding symbolizes the Heavens. The shimmering of gold acrylic and ribbon in contrast to the flesh toned paper draw our attention to the wonder of our Savior who is fully God and fully man.

Window Installations

The window installation’s lines represent the Word’s journey “down” from heaven into our sphere. It is made up of the artwork and stripes painted by the congregation during the Advent Workshop. All of the individual pieces come together in a quilt of beauty and light raining from heaven.

Community Group Questions

1. *The love we are supposed to show each other is the same love that God has shown us. Are there recent examples in your life where you have experienced another Christian extending that kind of love to you? What does that look like? Why is it hard to extend that type of love to each other?*
2. *How does our avoidance of conflict hurt our ability to truly love someone well? Conversely, how does our selfishness and our desire to be right hurt our ability to truly love someone well?*
3. *Take some time to pray for each other. Pray that the Holy Spirit would remind you of the amazing love God has already shown you. Pray that He would show you ways in which you are not loving well - either by avoiding conflict or by putting your desires first. Pray that He would show you somebody in your life that needs to experience the love of God, and that He would compel you to go minister to them.*

Children's question

God sent his son, Jesus, to die for our sins because he loved us. He loved us so much, that he did not want to let us go. As much as your parents love you, God loves us even more. Isn't that amazing! And because we are followers of Christ, we are supposed to love people that same way. What are some ways that you can show that kind of love to your parents or your brothers and sisters or your friends? Can you also pray for your parents as they try to love people too? They would love that.

Call to Communion and Prayer

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please eat the bread privately, and then drink the cup together with us after everyone has returned to their seats. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Children who have been examined by the elders and admitted to the Lord's Table are able to partake of Communion.

Keep my heart from self-deception. Protect me from any evil misleading or binding spirits. Calm my fears. Soften my cynicism.
