SUE'S SAFETY REPORT:

Summer is coming and we still need to use a lot of our snow safety tips. If you are doing summer sliding, hot as it may be, protect your head: it still needs that helmet. Wear a hat when off the hill but in the sun. Walking, riding, or siding your eyes need UV protection, and don't forget the bugs and dust. Your skin also needs protection from the sun and bugs. That little whistle I've been pushing makes a lot of noise; bring it along in case you get lost or stuck. You really need to hydrate. If you're on the trail or on a road trip, someone should know your plan.

I am going to keep it short ... When putting your skis or board away, a little wax will keep away the rust on the edges and or oxidation on the base. To safe fun: in the sun, water, rocks and on the dirt.

PACRAT NEWS:

The final report from the PACRAT website is: Last race and wouldn't you know we finally had a little rain. Fortunately it wasn't heavy and the course was salted and held up pretty well. Once again, a big thank you to everyone who helped, not only with this race but with the whole season. We were able to get all of our races in on the scheduled days, which hasn't happened



for a while. Despite the weather and Spring Break, race five had 130 racers show up out of 177 that are currently signed up. Schussing Shysters had just enough points from their seven racers to hold on to the lead and win the trophy by only four points over Ruttin' Rats. Rounding out the top five were The Ocho Plus, Oui Ski, and Ragnar's Two. Racy Brats was high scorer for the last race with 64 points. Remember we score the best four out of five races for each racer, so your worst scoring race was dropped for the final total. King and Queen Rat are awards to racers who show the most consistent and greatest improvement over the course of the season. This year's King Rat is Kerry Stevens (Schussing Shysters), who improved his handicap every race, with an overall improvement of 35%. Queen Rat is Tina Weber (Oui Ski) who showed improvement every race and had an overall improvement of 15%. As for individuals, Steve Sarich reclaimed the top spot for the third time this season and Marina Nimmo claimed her first fastest woman on the hill crown for the second time. What Happens at a Far West Convention?

Events include a silent auction on Friday Night, and the Travel Expo (where delegates meet one-on-one with resort personnel to plan future trips) on Saturday morning. You can attend educational leadership panel sessions such as Improving Social Media savvy or the latest equipment, meet and greet with ski personalities like Billy Kidd and Jordan Romero (the youngest person to climb Mt. Everest), and attend the awards banquet and dance on Saturday night (the theme is "Denim and Diamonds"). There will be a

business meeting on Sunday, at which time officers are elected, and other Association business takes place, as well as a sponsored brunch, and LOTS of door prizes to be given away. All of these events (and meals!) are included in your \$159 registration fee. Also available (for an additional fee) are optional events such as the Michael German Memorial Golf Tournament, Western Journey–Museum of the West & Fiesta Lunch, Discover Old Town Scottsdale via Segway, Scottsdale's Entertainment District Pub Crawl, Music Instrument Museum–World Music Experience & Kona Grill Lunch, or a Spa Lamar Day.

NOTE: The Far West Convention is hosted by a different ski club council each year. In 2014, it was held in Oregon, and it will come back to Oregon in 5 or 6 years. In 2015, it was held in San Diego, CA. Other typical locations are: San Diego (CA), Los Angeles (CA), Reno (NV), Phoenix (AZ), and the San Francisco Bay Area.

Far West is going to Fiji September 24-October 1, 2016 at the amazing Beqa Lagoon Resort; with a back-to-back trip October 1-October 8 at a different resort. 

Mt. Bachelor to Build New Lift, Expand Skiable Terrain by 635 Acres:

Mt. Bachelor skiers rejoice! It was

announced this week that a new high speed

detachable quad will be built over the summer, in time for opening next December. The lift has been a part of the resort's master plan for about three years now, but has been on hold until Powdr Corp, Mt. Bachelor's parent company, was ready to provide the funding. As locals likely know, there have already been trail expansions in the area which have been waiting on this new lift to open. Upon completion of the new lift, Mt. Bachelor will add 635 acres of lift served skiing, bringing the resort's total to 4,318 acres. Also of note: the vertical climb of the new lift will be just over 1,400 feet. So Benders get ready, your home mountain is going to be that much better next Winter!



Excerpts from the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

NEWEST ATTEMPT TO BUILD AMERICA'S FIRST INDOOR SKI RESORT ANNOUNCED:

America's first indoor ski resort dates back to 2004 as New Jersey's Xanadu Meadowlands, but construction stalled several times before a company called Triple Five took ownership of the project in 2013 and revamped the concept with another company called SNOW Operating which plan to open North America's first indoor snow center, Big SNOW America, at American Dream adjacent to the megaplex at the Meadowlands Sports Complex by 2017. The 12-story snow center hopes to offer year-round skiing, snowboarding, and snow tubing, surrounded by a collection of snow-focused retail outlets. Big

SNOW America will share American Dream which is supposed to have more than 450 other enterprises, including North America's largest fully-enclosed indoor DreamWorks Water Park, an amusement park, a 285-foot tall observation wheel, luxury movie theatres by Cinemex, a 70,000 square-foot Sea Life Aquarium & Lego Discovery Center, and an NHL-size ice rink. The Dream also features a 460,000 square-foot luxury and fashion area, and 15 full-service restaurants.

WHISTLER ANNOUNCE \$345 MILLION SPENDING PLANS:

Whistler Blackcomb has announced plans to invest \$345 million on upgrades in a three phase investment, to making the resort a bigger year-round attraction. Planned big ticket items include the Watershed, a 163,000 square foot facility featuring activities like waterslides, the latest deep water surf simulator technology, cliff jumping and rock climbing experiences, a wave pool, hot and cold pools, bowling, food and beverage facilities and retail amenities which will also include a new high-speed lift to replace the Magic Chair and connect Blackcomb's upper and lower bases by 2018.

Arizona to install its first high-speed 6 passenger lift. Arizona Snowbowl in Flagstaff will install the only high-speed 6-pack in Arizona. The new Grand Canyon Express is a 5.8 minute ride, and new trails and snowmaking will also be added at Snowbowl for next ski season.

ALTA'S SNOWBOARDER BAN TO CONTINUE: A legal attempt by a group of snowboarders to force Alta Ski Area to open its skier-only slopes to snowboarders was stopped by a panel of judges from the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals in Denver that upheld a lower court ruling and dismissed the case. The court found that the plaintiff, Wasatch Equality, failed to establish that the ban of snowboarders by Alta constituted an action by the state. Because Alta leases more than 80 percent of its resort from the National Forest Service, Wasatch Equality maintained that the ban violated the 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, which provides equal protection under the law. But just because the Forest Service annually reviews Alta's lease and operations plan, does not mean the state is forbidding snowboarders, the court found. "In granting Alta's and the Forest Service's motions to dismiss, the district court found that the Forest Service did nothing to influence Alta's decision to ban snowboards and the Forest Services' receipt of a usage fee each year didn't sufficiently involve the government to otherwise attribute the ban to the government," the ruling states. Of Alta's 2,130 acres, 1,800 are leased from the Forest Service. The court's ruling notes that 120 other ski

resorts across the country have similar arrangements with the Forest Service, where ski resorts rent the land.
