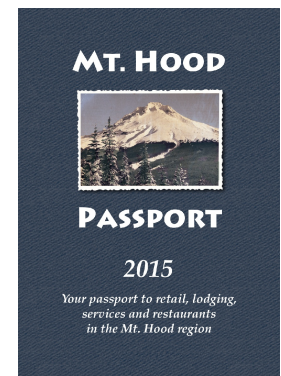

CLUB NEWS:

S'no Joke Ski Club is offering the trip of a lifetime **December 9-19, 2015, to scuba dive the Galapagos Islands!** Any member of a NWSCC club is eligible, but you have to sign up fast to secure a spot! The trip includes 8 days and 7 nights on the M/Y Nortada, an 85' motor yacht with a capacity of up to 12 passengers. Included are airport transfers; 2 nights in a hotel in Guayaquil, Ecuador; round trip airfare to and from Galapagos (Baltra Island); 7 nights on the yacht; tender transportation to all dives, air, weights, and weight belt; land visits and shore excursions, and all meals on the live aboard yacht with non alcoholic beverages; and a final night in a Guayaquil hotel. Airfare is not included; you need to make arrangements for your own flights, to arrive in Guayaquil on December 9 and your own flight home on or after December 19. The cost is \$5,940 pp/do, and one-half of the amount is due by March 31, 2015; final payment by August 31, 2015. Bergfreunde has had great success in recent years with planning non-ski trips to large cities where the participants do all the "touristy" things and get to know the city; about 50 people usually attend those trips. In May of 2015 they are going to Virginia, Washington DC, and the Outer Banks. They have also started a "meetup" to bring in new potential members to events.

The **Mt. Hood Cultural Center and Museum** lost out on one of its biggest fundraisers when the Ski the Glade Trail Day was unable to run as planned, due to brown slopes on the trail between Timberline and Government Camp (instead of white). Timberline generously offered to let participants ski there for the event, but only 14 participants instead of 75 leaves the Museum with a serious need for more fundraising. A women's fashion show was held in March, and a special men's fashion show and 2016 Season Preview will be held at the Museum on Saturday, April 18, starting at 5:00 pm. Tickets will be \$5 at the door, and outfits from Spyder will be sold to help raise money. SAFETY MESSAGE: Sue Rimkeit, NWSCC Director of Community Service and Safety, reported that clubs can "Adopt a Highway" for twice yearly cleanups in Oregon by calling Mariene Nichels at 503-665-4006. Already participating are Skiyente, Schnee Vogeli, and Mountain High, all with designated cleanup areas on Highway 26 near Government Camp.

Another safety issue noted by Sue recently was a sea of skis laid on the ground by young racers outside a ski lodge on race day, making it very hazardous for anyone approaching the lodge not to step on skis and possibly fall on them. Her comments to management led to the skis being placed on racks by the racers the following day.

A final tip for everyone's safety: don't stop in the middle of a run, especially suddenly, whether or not you are visible from above. Try to pull off on the sides of the run.

The package price for the hotel will be \$1,430 pp/do; for 2 bedroom condos the price will be \$1,330 pp/do; and for either 3 or 4 bedroom condos the price will be \$1,200! These prices are for land only (no air or transfers), but include 7 nights' lodging, Welcome Party, Pub Crawl, Council Night Dinner, Mountain Picnic (not accessible to non-skiers, due to location), Après Ski Party, Races, a Banquet with dancing, and 6 of 7 day Lift Ticket (no senior discount). Warmer Climate Creating Havoc at Ski Resorts: As New England areas confronted sidewalk avalanches and dug themselves out from underneath multiple blizzards, West Coast skiers this year dealt with the opposite problem. Squaw Valley, which averaged 450 inches of snowfall per year between 2008 and 2014, received less than a third of that amount this season, according to a February snow report. The snowpack situation is so dire there that the International Ski Federation canceled the skicross and snowboardcross World Cup two weeks before it was scheduled to launch, in early March.

Much has been made about the impact of global warming, but nowhere is it felt deeper than at ski resort towns, whose economies depend almost entirely on snowfall. If it doesn't snow, no one comes to town to ski, which means no one attends après activities, or buys groceries or gasoline, and the town loses a revenue stream it depends on. This is happening across the entire western high country. "It's a bigger issue than, 'Oh, we can't ski,'" says Diana Madson, executive director of the non-profit Mountain Pact. "It's loss of jobs and major environmental degradation." The country's \$12.2 billion winter tourism industry can't survive on snow-gun slopes. Ski resorts account for 36

percent of winter tourism-related employment. In order to protect winter—and the hundreds of thousands whose livelihoods depend upon a snow-filled season—we must act now to support policies that protect our climate, and in turn, our slopes.
