FWSA NEWS AND TRIPS:

Far West Ski Week 2016: Telluride Ski Resort is the location for the Far West Ski Week trip January 30-February 6, 2016. **\$800 deposits are now being accepted for this trip, but note that payment in full is due by October 15.** NWSCC will have ski in/ski out lodging in condos at Bear Creek Lodge. The package price for 2 bedroom condos is \$1,340 pp/do; and for either 3 or 4 bedroom condos the price will be \$1,210 pp/do! These prices are for land only (no air or transfers), but include 7 nights' lodging, Welcome Party, Pub Crawl, Council Night Dinner, Mountain Picnic (not accessible to non-skiers, due to location), Après Ski Party, Races, a Banquet with dancing, and 6 of 7 day Lift Ticket (no senior discount). San Gimignano, and 4 nights in Rome. New this year: If one chooses to not go to Cortina, we will fly you from the US to join us for the extension trip – we call this the "Stand Alone" trip. Powder Alliance is Growing: The Powder Alliance has grown from 13 to 14 ski areas. The most recent addition is Whitewater, B.C. Mt. Hood Skibowl and Timberline are both members of the Alliance. So, anyone with a Fusion Pass to these 2 ski areas can have 3 free days at each of the other 12 ski areas. That's a total of 36 free ski days if you ski them all, plus unlimited skiing at Timberline and Mt. Hood Skibowl on Mt. Hood. The other 12 ski areas are (alphabetically): Angel Fire, NM; Arizona Snowbowl; Bridger Bowl, MT; China Peak, CA; Crested Butte, CO; Mountain High, CA; Schweitzer Mt., ID; Sierra-at-Tahoe, CA; Silver Star, BC; Snowbasin, UT; Stevens Pass, WA; and Whitewater, BC.

Excerpts from the FAR WEST SKI NEWS:

Purgatory is Purgatory Once Again: The southern Colorado ski area of Purgatory, which has been known as "Durango Mountain Resort" for the past decade, has a new owner. Local businessman James Coleman is the resort's new owner, and he is changing the ski area's title back to its original name of Purgatory. The resort will be celebrating its 50th season in 2016.

Far West Ski Foundation Website: The Far West Ski Foundation has a new, BIG, beautiful, entertaining and educational website. Designed by Crissymarie King, the site is designed to show details of the four principal missions of the Foundation, and provides a way to make tax deductible contributions to support these missions. Each program – alpine racing, adaptive skiing, women's ski jumping, and legacy preservation - has at least one gallery of images on the site. FWSA Scholarship winners and the national jumping team members will be updated annually. Scholarship sponsors and partners are recognized here. Legacy preservation features the Mt. Hood Museum and Cultural Center and the latest news on the Squaw Valley Olympic Museum and Winter Sports Heritage Center. Check it out: <http://farwestskifoundation.org>.

Founder of Snowbird Passes: Dick Bass, partner and chairman of Snowbird Ski and Summer Resort, passed away on Sunday, July 26 at the age of 85, in Dallas, Texas. Bass spent 44 years building Snowbird into a world-renowned, year-round destination mountain resort. He maintained sole ownership of the resort until selling the majority interest in Snowbird in May 2014. Dick received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Ski Areas Association in 2006.

Excerpts from the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

More Resorts for The Mountain Collective: The Mountain Collective™ has widened its geographic reach with the addition of two destinations to its roster. Stowe joins the Mountain Collective as its first resort on the East Coast, while Taos extends passholder access into New Mexico. The resorts join Sun Valley, Alta Snowbird, Aspen Snowmass, Ski Banff-Lake Louise-Sunshine Village, Jackson Hole, Mammoth Mountain, and Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows in the US, plus Australia's Thredbo, and Canada's Whistler Blackcomb, in Mountain Collective passes which are on sale for \$399 USD. The Mountain Collective™ Pass includes grants access to 21 mountains with more than 43,400 acres of terrain and 271 lifts for two days of skiing or riding at each of the eleven destinations, plus a 50 percent discount on all additional days at those resorts with no blackout dates.

Whistler Blackcomb Gets Personal: Whistler Blackcomb will be introducing WB+ this winter season, a new online

interactive platform connected to the ski resort's RFID technology which the BC resort introduced last year. WB+ will give guests the option to create a personal profile in order to collect stats and data about their days on the mountains. By having their lift passes automatically scanned as they pass RFID chairlift access gates located around Whistler and Blackcomb mountains, skiers and boarders will be able keep track of personal stats including their number of days on the slopes and total vertical ridden. Customized privacy settings will allow users to make their WB+ profiles accessible to friends, family members and work colleagues, allowing groups to create goals and fun challenges throughout the winter.

Vail is first resort to ban pot in Colorado: Vail's temporary ban on retail marijuana could become permanent very soon. Although 2012's Amendment 64 legalized the recreational sale of pot, towns and counties were still allowed to impose their own bans. In the Vail Valley, retail operations were allowed in unincorporated Eagle County and the town of Eagle, but the Vail Town Council has never permitted recreational sales. Now, after the Vail Town Council passed yet another extension of a 2014 moratorium banning pot shops, the council will consider a permanent ban. Opponents of recreational marijuana in Vail say that the drug is available in Eagle-Vail, only a short jaunt up the highway. Others fear that sales of marijuana in town could have a negative effect on tourism. Proponents of retail sales in Vail argue that it will add to the region's already booming economy. Currently, Vail is the only major ski-resort town that bans retail operations, although other towns (like Breckenridge) have set limited areas where those shops can operate.

Mt. Norquay is oldest resort in North America: One of North America's oldest ski areas, and the oldest in the Canadian Rockies, Banff's local ski area on Mt Norquay celebrates 90 years of operations this winter, having originally opened in 1926. The first ski cabin was built there in 1927 and the first rope tow installed in 1941. The North American or "Big Chair" has been providing riders with Bow Valley view's since 1948, making it one of the oldest chairs in North America. To mark this 90th anniversary, Mt. Norquay will be celebrating with many special events throughout the season. There's also an all new terrain park to prove you're never too old, featuring a two jump large line with a 30' Jump and a 40' jump. The additional intermediate rail line has everything your hard-core jibber would love, featuring a 7 rail and box line that lets people get all kinds of wacky as they tear through the middle of the park. The park will also cater to the little shredders with a small-medium line followed by small boxes. See www.banffnorquay.com
