Dale Parshall’s commentary about the race season is as follows: “The weather gods didn’t want us to get in that last race, but our dedicated race crew and 111 die hard racers got it done. Way to go! So remembering that we count the best 4 out of 5 races for each racer, Ruttin’ Rats added 52 points to their Race 4 total to retake the lead and win the season’s top spot. Racy Brats were a comfortable 2nd, and Kiss My Wax held on to 3rd. The other big mover on the day was Frosted Flakes who added 53 points to their Race 4 total to jump from 21st to 12th, just out of the awards. King and Queen Rat are awards to racers who show the most consistent and greatest improvement over the course of the season. This year’s King Rat is Ted Stagnone (Tasmanian Ski Devils) who improved his handicap every race and showed an overall improvement of 72%. Queen Rat is Jill Parshall (Racy Brats) who showed improvement every race and had an overall improvement of 30%. For Race 5, Jay Pollock claimed the last fastest man on the hill title, making for three different fastest men for the year. On the ladies side, Colleen Walter claimed her fourth fastest woman on the hill title of the year. NORTHWEST SNOWSPORTS ADVOCATES NEWS:

Mt. Ashland needs YOUR help - financially this time. Mt. Ashland received a ruling this summer allowing it to proceed with the construction of two ski lifts, new runs, and expanding the parking area, but first it needs to raise money to finance the improvements. As a nonprofit, a successful capital campaign is essential to the success of the project.

Mt. Ashland will celebrate its 50th anniversary during the 2013-14 ski season with improvements that will add 90 new parking spaces and make the ski area more user friendly for beginning skiers and snowboarders. This project will mark the first physical improvements to the ski area since 1987 when the Sonnet and Comer chairlifts were installed. With an estimated cost of \$250,000, the improvements will primarily be funded through donations to the ski area. As of April 1, 2013, the ski area has raised \$137,200 in private donations for this project. Your help is needed!

Get the Best Deal on 2014 Passes Now: For decades, lift tickets and season pass pricing followed a very simple and crude method – raise the price every single year, whether demand was rising or falling. In recent years, there has been a paradigm shift in the ski industry to pre-sell discounted (sometimes heavily discounted) season passes and lift tickets a year ahead of time. Part of the reason is better marketing, while a larger part is savvy buyers who are used to getting better pricing through the internet within set timeframes.

With all of the new joint passes being offered, from Vail's Epic Pass to the Rocky Mountain Super Pass, to the Ski Salt Lake Super Pass, to the Mountain Collective, which is actually a bundle of 12 tickets good for 2 days at each partnered area, season pass offers can be found at some screaming-deal prices right now. Check online for your favorite area and get your 2014 pass now.

Timberline Lodge Receives Honor: Not only did Timberline Lodge on Mt. Hood, Oregon, turn 75 years old this year, the National Trust for Historic Preservation has accepted them onto the list of Historic Hotels of America. Rich in history and architectural beauty, Timberline Lodge was built during the depression of the 1930's as part of the Works Progress Administration's "make-work program." The lodge received National Historic Landmark recognition in 1977. It attracts more than two million visitors annually. You can ski Timberline Ski Area 10 months a year, and their Palmer Glacier is the training ground for many Olympic and future Olympic skiers and riders each summer.

FAR WEST SKI FOUNDATION: The American Taxpayer Relief Act extends the rules for charitable contributions from IRAs or Roth IRAs to December 31, 2013. Individuals over 70½ years of age may transfer funds directly to a charity from their IRAs without it being counted as income. The Far West Ski Foundation can receive your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) and if desired, direct it to one of the Foundation's funds, such as the Far West Athletic Scholarship, the Westlund Fund (rehab through snow sports), Women's Ski Jumping, or Snowsports History and Museums. From the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

HOW THE CHARLOTTE SKI CLUB IS ATTRACTING YOUNGER MEMBERS: When Pat Harvey, VP of the Crescent Ski Council, told NSCN that the Charlotte Ski & Snowboard Club in North Carolina has been very successful in attracting and adding younger members to our Club. We asked her to tell us how they did it. Here is her response:

Currently both our incoming and outgoing President are around 35 years old. The oldest of the other officers is 50! Most of the younger members are coming from our racing program (we had about 40 racers compete from our Club this year), through the social networking sites – particularly our Facebook page and Meetup – and our Club's website –

which is updated regularly and has a link to our Club's Facebook page.

One of the biggest attractions in getting the new younger members is that once a Club has a few, and they come to the Club's meetings, the younger guests at the meetings see that the Club isn't all an older group of people, they stay and get interested and in our Club's case have gotten involved. We highly recommend that all the Clubs have Facebook page (rather than a Facebook group which is harder to work and interact with). We've also set up a page for Crescent Ski Council in the southeast which is regularly updated with news from the resorts, the trips and other events offered by the Clubs in our Council. We "like" the other Clubs who are on Facebook and also to the resorts and this has become another tool to attract skiers and snowboarders to the Clubs in the Southeast.

IT WAS A GOOD YEAR FOR THE SKI INDUSTRY: The 2012-2013 ski season's turnaround was due to good snowfall in many parts of the country, according to information released by the National Ski Areas Association that said 78 percent of ski resorts across the country indicated they gained visits this season. The median was a 10.6 percent increase. The NSAA reported that skier and snowboard rider visits were up about 11 percent this season to an estimated 56.6 million although the national trade association's final report won't be released until July.

NEW LIFTS FOR SKI RESORTS:

Alyeska Resort is replacing their Chair 6 with a new high-speed detachable quad. The current Chair 6 provides primary lift access to the upper mountain trails at Alyeska Resort and was originally installed in 1988.

Whistler is replacing Harmony Mountain's high-speed quad with a new six-pack, Harmony 6, which will service terrain from the edge of the Symphony Amphitheater all the way to Glacier Bowl, adjacent to the Peak Express.

Blackcomb Mountain will replace its current fixed-grip triple chair with a new quad in the Crystal Zone. Construction begins this spring with completion expected in time for the beginning of the 2013-14 season.

June Mountain is set to reopen December, 2013 after being closed for a year. The resort will continue to target families and entry-level skiers and snowboarders, with tentative plans for lift and snowmaking upgrades down the road. Mammoth Mountain, which owns June, will invest \$6 million in a new chairlift for June once the necessary permits are acquired.
