The **Mt. Hood Cultural Center and Museum** has a summer fundraiser, **The Barlow Road Ride, August 17-18, 2013**.

This is a two-day out-and-back century (100 mile) bike tour from the end of the Oregon Trail in Oregon City to Government Camp, with an optional trip up the West Leg Trail to Timberline Lodge. If you are a Cycle Oregon rider, then the BRR is the perfect training ride. However, there are lots of options for people who still want to participate, but who don't want that long uphill course. There is something for everyone who likes to bicycle for fun and a good cause. The festival is open to all riders, visitors and community. PACRAT NEWS:

Need your racing fix this summer? PACRAT Vice Chairman Greg Dilger suggests that you might want to sign up for the **Summer Fun Nationals at Timberline July 19-21, 2013!** This will be the 25th annual summer race sanctioned by USSA. Greg says "This is a great race with GS on Saturday, a great party Saturday night and Slalom on Sunday. Great competition, but not overly difficult courses. Worth your time if you get a chance. ... We get racers from all over the country, even some from other countries. The race is open to all ages. We usually have 100 to 150 racers. One course for the "younger men" and a separate course for older men, women and children." Check out the website at <http://www.summerfunnationals.com>. 2013-2014 USSA License or Temporary Registration is required and available through links to USSA on www.SummerFunNationals.com.

Would you like to continue your race training during the summer? You'll have your chance **July 15-19, 2013, at the WILLY CAMP at Timberline**, which is open to both Masters adults and juniors; the Summer Fun race will follow on the weekend for anyone who holds a USSA license. The cost is \$325 for the week (you buy your own lift tickets), and includes 3 days of GS training and 2 days of Slalom training. NEW THIS SUMMER are individual race training days currently scheduled for June 18-21, 24, 25, 27, and 28; and July 1, 9, 10, 12, 22, 24, 25, and 28-31. Reservations must be made at least a day in advance; a minimum of 4 athletes must sign up or that training day will be canceled. The price is \$75/day (you provide your own lift tickets), or a 5-punch for \$325 or a 10-punch for \$600. The 5-punch and 10-punch may be used during Willy Camp. The more ski areas you ski, the better your chances of a bigger prize! Tickets will be turned in to NWSCC at the end of the season; the winner is usually announced at Appreciation Night in the summer.

NORTHWEST SNOWSPORTS ADVOCATES NEWS:

Mt. Ashland needs YOUR help - financially this time. Mt. Ashland received a ruling this summer allowing it to proceed with the construction of two ski lifts, new runs, and expanding the parking area, but first it needs to raise money to finance the improvements. As a nonprofit, a successful capital campaign is essential to the success of the project.

Mt. Ashland will celebrate its 50th anniversary during the 2013-14 ski season with improvements that will add 90 new parking spaces and make the ski area more user friendly for beginning skiers and snowboarders. This project will mark the first physical improvements to the ski area since 1987 when the Sonnet and Comer chairlifts were installed. With an estimated cost of \$250,000, the improvements will primarily be funded through donations to the ski area. As of April 1, 2013, the ski area has raised \$137,200 in private donations for this project. Your help is needed!

FWSA NEWS AND TRIPS:

Far West Elections: Elections of officers took place June 9 at the FWSA Annual Meeting & Convention at the Grand Sierra Resort & Casino in Reno, Nevada. FWSA now has a new President: Linda Scott of the Intermountain Council!

June 27-30 is the **FWSA Summer Fun Adventure at Mammoth Mountain**. More details for the trip have been posted on the FWSA website at www.fwsa.org/Travel/Adventure/2013-FWSA-Mammoth/2013-FWSA-Mammoth.html. The cost of \$30 for children and \$50 for teens or adults (free for children age 5 or under) includes Friday breakfast, Friday evening campfire and snacks, and Saturday night BBQ with all the trimmings. Special rates are available for lodging and bike rentals; lots of outdoor activities are available (some fee, some free).

November 9-16, 2013, FWSA is planning a Caribbean cruise. Details, with pricing, will be available on their website soon.

The 4th annual **FWSA Scuba Dive Trip** will be September 7 –14, 2013, to the wonderful island of Ambergris Caye in Belize, and includes seven nights lodging at Ramon's Village (double occupancy), 6 days of 2-tank boat dives, full breakfast daily, plus airport transfers. Far West Ski Week 2014 will be in Beaver Creek, Colorado. The dates will be January 25 to February 1, 2014. We now have our lodging assignments, and the first flier is attached. The price is \$1,229 pp including 7 nights' lodging, a 5 out of 7 day lift pass, and the FWSA amenities package. A \$100 deposit will hold your place on this trip!

The **Far West "Mini Ski Week" will be held February 22-27, 2014**, and will be based in Davis County, Utah, with skiing at Snowbasin (and possibly other areas). The land package price ranges from \$425 to \$475 (pp/do), including 5 nights lodging at the La Quinta Hotel in Layton, Utah; 3 or 4 lift tickets to Snowbasin; transportation to/from Snowbasin; a welcome party; daily deluxe continental breakfast, pub crawl, and a farewell dinner & party at Antelope Island State Park. Transportation to and from Layton is not included, but more surprises are being added to the already fantastic package! Senior, children, and teen prices will also be available.

For your future planning purposes, the 2015 Mini Ski Week will be at Whitefish Mountain Resort, Montana.

FWSA offers one USA ski week, one European ski week (usually with pre and post-trip extensions), and a number of "adventure" trips. Far West International Ski Week 2014: The RFP has been sent out to seven tour operator companies for FWSA's 2014 International Ski Trip to Zermatt, Switzerland

with an extension to Spain and/or Portugal. The last time FWSA went to Zermatt was in 2004, and it's time to return. We are looking at March 6-23, 2014. The exact details will be provided once a bid decision has been made.

FROM FWSA NEWS:

Get the Best Deal on 2014 Passes Now: For decades, lift tickets and season pass pricing followed a very simple and crude method – raise the price every single year, whether demand was rising or falling. In recent years, there has been a paradigm shift in the ski industry to pre-sell discounted (sometimes heavily discounted) season passes and lift tickets a year ahead of time. Part of the reason is better marketing, while a larger part is savvy buyers who are used to getting better pricing through the internet within set timeframes.

With all of the new joint passes being offered, from Vail's Epic Pass to the Rocky Mountain Super Pass, to the Ski Salt Lake Super Pass, to the Mountain Collective, which is actually a bundle of 12 tickets good for 2 days at each partnered area, season pass offers can be found at some screaming-deal prices right now. Check online for your favorite area and get your 2014 pass now.

FAR WEST SKI FOUNDATION: The American Taxpayer Relief Act extends the rules for charitable contributions from IRAs or Roth IRAs to December 31, 2013. Individuals over 70½ years of age may transfer funds directly to a charity from their IRAs without it being counted as income. The Far West Ski Foundation can receive your Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) and if desired, direct it to one of the Foundation's funds, such as the Far West Athletic Scholarship, the Westlund Fund (rehab through snow sports), Women's Ski Jumping, or Snowsports History and Museums. From the NATIONAL SKI CLUB NEWS:

VAIL LEASES CANYONS/ ADDS AUSTRIA'S ARLBERG TO EPIC PASS Vail Resorts has entered into a long-term lease for Canyons Resort in Park City, Utah to assume all resort operations of Canyons. Vail Resorts also announced a partnership with the Arlberg region of Austria, home to the mountain resorts of St. Anton, Lech-Zürs, St. Christoph and Stuben. Vail's Epic Pass will now feature five free consecutive days of skiing and riding in Arlberg, bringing access to 16 mountains in three countries: Verbier, in Switzerland, Arlberg, in Austria, Vail, Beaver Creek, Breckenridge, Keystone, Arapahoe Basin and Eldora in Colorado, and Heavenly, Northstar and Kirkwood in Lake Tahoe -- and now the Canyons in Utah.

NEW VAIL LIFT WILL FEATURE FIRST LOADING CONVEYOR SYSTEM FOR A HIGH-SPEED, SIX-PASSENGER LIFT IN NORTH AMERICA Vail Mountain announced that it has received approval to construct a new high-speed, 6-passenger Doppelmayr chairlift, replacing the 4-passenger Mountaintop Express Lift (#4) from Mid-Vail to Patrol Headquarters for the 2013-2014 ski season. The Mountaintop Express will feature loading gates with a right angle load and a loading conveyor system to reduce the number of lift stops and slows. The system, used throughout European resorts for

years, will mark the first loading conveyor on a high-speed, six-passenger lift of its kind in North America.

The resort has also received final approval to replace the Gopher Hill Lift (#12), a fixed-grip double chairlift, with a fixed-grip triple chairlift which was removed from Beaver Creek in 2011.

SALT LAKE CITY TO GET A NEW AIRPORT Workers are set to break ground by next spring on Salt Lake City's new airport, which will be right next to the existing facility, and the city hopes to have it finished by 2024. Salt Lake's original airport facility was designed to handle about 12 million travelers each year, about half as many as now pass through it. Officials and architects have sketched out designs and they're asking travelers what they'd like to see at the airport. Authorities say the planned airport will have a design that showcases its mountain views and will be more environmentally responsible -- with a goal to try to generate as much energy as it uses. Last year, about 21 million people passed through the airport and the redesign is set to accommodate approximately 24 million travelers annually.
