Regular meetings will be held in May and June 2010 (when elections are held); the July 21 meeting will be "Appreciation Night" held at the Parshall home on Blue Lake for all NWSCC volunteers, club officers, commercial members, and anyone else deserving to be appreciated!

RECAP OF APRIL NWSCC MEETING:

There was a discussion of the Bachelor Blast trip just concluded, and how fantastic the weather, skiing, and entire trip was for the 36 participants. The Sunriver Resort Tennis Village condos were a beautiful place to stay! Mt. Bachelor provided a delicious luncheon, and special guests were Jordan Schweitzer and Haley Hanseler, two young ski racers who are tops in the nation, and are scholarship winners through FWSA's Scholarship Fund. Dick Shawkey of the FWSA Scholarship Committee and FWSA Foundation came up from California for the event, and discussed the scholarship program, which gave out \$10,000 in scholarships last year. One of their main fundraisers includes a drawing held annually at the FWSA Convention for various prizes - but tickets are available for anyone who wants to support a worthy organization and possibly win a summer 3-day heli hiking trip for 2 people which is offered through Canadian Mountain Holidays. Last year's winner was so thrilled with her trip that she has booked another trip this summer! Tickets are one for \$5, or five for \$20, and are available through NWSCC (ask Sheri Parshall).

Skiyente Ski Club funds a scholarship every year through FWSA Foundation for a young woman racer from the Pacific Northwest, and Jordan Schweitzer has been the

recipient of their scholarship. Mountain High Snowsport Club was inspired to say that they will do the same in the future.

Barbara Bousum reported on her attendance at the most recent **Mountain Travel Symposium** (held this year in Banff). This annual event puts buyers of group travel in direct contact with sellers of group travel. There were about 140 representatives from ski clubs and councils, with about 200 representatives from the ski travel industry! On one day the club reps have about 40 nine-minute appointments with vendors of their choice who want your group to take advantage of their services or visit their resort! Only one representative is invited from each club or council, and the rep should be planning to lead a trip using some of the vendors present. If your club takes trips and hasn't ever sent a representative to this event, you should make sure you get on the invitation list for next year!

NWSCC's Annual **Clubs 4 Play Golf Tournament** will be held **Sunday, July 25**, at **Lewis River Golf Course** in Washington (an amazing course!). Tee-offs start at 10:00. Fee: \$89. Sandi Shaub provided fliers and team sign-up forms. They are also available on the NWSCC's website. We are likely to have teams travel from Seattle to participate. Get your teams signed up! Sheri Parshall advised that the **World Cup Dreams** event will again be coming to the slopes at Timberline July 16-17, 2010. As noted on their web site, the fundraiser helps 'to provide National Alpine Ski Team members with the financial resources needed to help them achieve their ski racing goals and compete at their highest level...through financial support and disability insurance coverage.' For more information, visit their web site at www.worldcupdreams.org. There will be a kids camp (up to age 12) at Timberline with US Ski Team members as coaches. The fee is \$350 per day, or \$600 for the weekend, which includes breakfast, lunch, and training. For everyone, there will again be a Saturday night banquet and silent auction at the Multnomah Athletic Club for \$125 per person. There is some really great stuff at the auction, including autographed photos and ski racing suits donated by the athletes. Sheri is working on the event this year, and needs helpers! Last year's event raised about \$30,000! The Council used to support the Golden Rose event which was a US Ski Team fundraiser, and perhaps we could support this event as well.

Emilio Trampuz reported on the **Hope on the Slopes** event held at Mt. Hood Skibowl March 19-20, saying the event was a great success! Last year was its inaugural year, and the event raised \$24,000 with 100 participants and some contribution from Skibowl - this year there were 180 participants, with less contribution from Skibowl, and it raised over \$50,000 for the American Cancer Society! There were over 3 million vertical feet of skiing (and boarding) tallied during the event. Aaron Anderson placed third, even after breaking his thumb, getting it taped up, and continuing to ski - he was making 5 minute laps in the Upper Bowl, including the chair ride, and flying off the lip down the main run. Charley Ritchie's team brought in the most money in fundraising. Two videos of the event will eventually be posted on the website at community.acsevents.org/site/TR?fr_id=25687&pg=entry. Mark your calendar for the third weekend in March 2011 for the next event!

CLUB INFORMATION:

NWSCC member clubs are welcome to sign up with Sheri Parshall to present a brief history of their club at upcoming Council meetings. The **2010 FWSA Convention** will be held **June 10-14, 2010**, at the luxurious **Renaissance Esmeralda Resort and Spa at Indian Wells, California!** The theme is "Thanks for the Memories," and you will feel like a movie star as you soak in the luxury of \$400 rooms starting at only \$139 (per room, not per person), in addition to all the Convention activities that will be offered. Gordy Lusk says that the golf tournament will be held at a course where the green fees are usually \$250 and the PGA Skins Game is held! NWSCC is the host of a Pool Party on Friday afternoon, which will be a riot! Expect to meet celebrities (ski related), take wonderful tours, enjoy a pub crawl and scavenger hunt, dress up as your favorite celebrity for the big dinner/dance Saturday night, meet lots of club movers and shakers from across the United States, learn at the seminars, and of course bid on fantastic trips at the \$100,000 plus silent auction! How about a really memorable way to celebrate the new year in 2011? FWSA is joining Holidaze Ski Tours for an **Antarctica Adventure & New Year's Eve in Buenos Aires December 29, 2010-January 12, 2011!!!** Participants will leave December 29, 2010, for a 15 day trip with 3 nights in Buenos Aires, followed by a flight to Ushuaia and a 10-day cruise on the MS Fram. The cruise includes meals, lectures, guided tours and many fantastic locations and sights you have only seen on TV, including whales, seals, penguins, icebergs, snowy peaks, ice cliffs, and much more! The last night will be at a hotel in Ushuaia. Prices including airfare from JFK or LAX start at approximately \$5,800 pp/do including extra charges, and go up from there - but this is probably a once in a lifetime opportunity!

FWSA will offer a trip to Switzerland (Engelberg and Interlaken) February 26-March 7, 2011, starting around

\$1,725. A Bulgaria extension March 7-12 will be offered starting around \$839, and a further extension to Bucharest and Romania is still being negotiated. See the revised fliers (including a NEW flier for the Bulgaria extension) for details.

NWSCC is now taking \$100 deposits for the 2011 FWSA Ski Week in Sun Valley (January 22-29, 2011). This will be a very popular trip, and your early deposit will guarantee you a spot with your choice of lodging. See the attached Sun Valley Lodging listing to determine what type of lodging you would like to request. Anticipated costs range from \$895 to \$1325 per person without transportation (consider that Sun Valley's lift tickets are \$82 this year!). This is a great trip from the Northwest, as Sun Valley is within driving distance for most of us, saving the cost and hassles of airfare. A limited number of airline seats will be reserved for NWSCC participants, as we expect more people would wish to drive. NWSCC has only 80 spots on this trip (and the last time FWSA went to Sun Valley there was a waiting list), so send your deposits early. Mark your check for the 2011 FWSA Sun Valley trip and mail it to the NWSCC post office box. If you change your mind for any reason, your deposit will be fully refundable until sometime this summer when final details are announced and installment payments are due.

Interested in a **chance to WIN a spot on the FWSA Sun Valley trip** valued at \$950+? NWSCC will be selling tickets, with the drawing to be held at NWSCC's annual Appreciation Night, July 21, 2010. The cost is \$20 for one ticket or \$50 for three tickets. If you have already paid a deposit at that time, your deposit will be refunded. Tickets are available through Sheri Parshall or other NWSCC officers. Scott Kaden, Executive Director of the Pacific Northwest Ski Areas Association, reports that PNSAA has announced winners of annual awards at its recent meeting in Bend, Oregon. **Keith Petrie** was honored with the prestigious **Mel Borgersen Lifetime Achievement Award** (which has only been bestowed upon 7 individuals since 1957). Many of our clubs dealt with Keith over the years, as he was formerly general manager of Mt. Hood Meadows, Anthony Lakes, Mt. Spokane, and Multitorpor Ski Bowl. He was Chairman of the Board of Directors of PNSAA for 11 years, and served 6 years on the National Ski Areas Association's Board of Directors. Keith also was executive director of the Mt. Hood Recreation Association, and was influential in establishment of the Oregon Ski Industries Association (OSIA or Ski Oregon). Keith actively represented the ski industry at the Oregon Legislative Assembly for 25 years. He was also on the board of the Oregon Winter Sports Advisory Council, was an advisor on the development of Oregon's snowpark system, helped establish standards for night lighting of ski areas, regulations for studded tire use and the traction device laws, formulation of "Good Samaritan" laws, and much more. Keith is truly deserving of this great honor, and I am proud to have known him.

In addition, PNSAA presented **Eric Bakken**, Mountain Manager of 49 Degrees North Ski Area, with the **PNSAA Tower of Excellence Award**, which "recognizes a ski area employee who has steadfastly contributed to the success of a ski area's operation." **Hollis "Gene" Rice**

received the **Ski Industry Service Award** posthumously for his 35-year career with Riblet Tramway Company, followed by a second career with Liftram, Inc., and Liftram Engineering, where he was an expert ski lift inspector until his death in June of 2009 at 85 years of age. **Kim DiRienz**, a snow ranger and special use coordinator who administers the 49 Degrees North Mountain Resort permit for the Colville National Forest, was honored as the **Forest Service Partner of the Year**.
