RECAP OF JUNE NWSCC MEETING:
Colleen Walter reported on the Far West convention just concluded at Indian Wells (Palm Springs), California. Thursday night there was an amazing pub crawl where Elvis and other celebrities were in attendance. Friday's activities included a golf tournament, tram ride and hike, spa treatment, and tour of the celebrity homes. NWSCC was the host of a pool party in the afternoon sponsored by Mt. Bachelor with 108 attendees. Friday night was the silent auction, which grossed about \$41,000 for \$94,000+ worth of packages (bargains, anyone?). Saturday's activities included Travel Expo, where attendees met with representatives from ski areas, tour operators, and lodging properties to learn information for potential club trips. There were two Snowsports Leadership Academy classes, one on ethics and the other on social media and networking, and a panel session on public affairs. Richard Rizk won the Safety Award, with a prize of an all expense paid week in Aspen for two! Skiyente Ski Club won the Charities Award and a check for \$100 to go to the charity of its choice. A check for \$1450 was presented to the Far West Foundation, representing \$950 from Skiyente and \$500 from Mountain High Snowsport Club for scholarships for deserving young ski racers in the Pacific Northwest.

NWSCC and its clubs got a number of awards during convention! NWSCC's new website won first place among the Councils - nice going, John! This newsletter also won first place among the Councils. Mountain High Snowsport Club won first place as the top Class AAA club, as well as first place for its newsletter and third place for its website. Apparently none of our other clubs entered this year, as the other winners were clubs from other Councils.

Next year's convention will be held in Industry Hills, California (Los Angeles area) June 9-12, 2011. It is apparently closer to the Ontario airport than the Los

Angeles airport, and I happily discovered on my way home from Palm Springs that there are some direct flights from Portland to Ontario!

NWSCC's Annual **Clubs 4 Play Golf Tournament** will be held **Sunday, July 25, at Lewis River Golf Course** in Washington (an amazing course!). Tee-offs start at 10:00. Fee: \$89. Sandi Shaub provided fliers and team sign-up forms. They are also available on the NWSCC's website. We are likely to have teams travel from Seattle to participate. Get your teams signed up! Sheri Parshall advised that the **World Cup Dreams** event will again be coming to the slopes at Timberline July 16-17, 2010. As noted on their web site, this fundraiser helps "to provide National Alpine Ski Team members with the financial resources needed to help them achieve their ski racing goals and compete at their highest level...through financial support and disability insurance coverage." For more information, visit their web site at www.worldcupdreams.org. There will be a kids camp (up to age 12) at Timberline with US Ski Team members as coaches. The fee is \$350 per day, or \$600 for the weekend, which includes breakfast, lunch, and training. For everyone, there will again be a Saturday night banquet and silent auction at the Multnomah Athletic Club for \$125 per person. There is some really great stuff at the auction, including autographed photos and ski racing suits donated by the athletes. Sheri is working on the event this year, and needs helpers! Last year's event raised about \$30,000! The Council used to support the Golden Rose event which was a US Ski Team fundraiser, and perhaps we could support this event as well.

Dale Parshall advised that the former "Keystone Nationals" - a race training and national race event - is planned to be held midweek during the first week of January 2011, and is to be held at Aspen this year! Details will follow as they are known.

Shawn Storey said that **Bergfreunde Ski Club** has a full summer schedule of hiking, biking, golf, and trips to Hawaii and to the Washington Olympics.

John Reinhardt announced that **Cabernet Ski & Sail Club** in conjunction with the San Diego Council will be running a **5-night trip to Aspen in December for under \$1,000!** He will have more information later.

Cascade Prime Timers has some special summer trips, including an annual Holland Bike and Barge trip, and a Bike and Hike trip to Austria. Their annual trip to Big Sky is scheduled January 1-8, 2011. There are lots of activities besides skiing: hiking, kayaking, bridge, etc. While trips are for members only, membership is only \$35 for persons over 50 years old.

Mountain High Snowsport Club has an active golf group, and has some hikes planned. It has adopted a stretch of Highway 26 close to Schnee Vogeli's designated stretch, and had to reschedule its first pickup day from May 22, when there was a big snowstorm covering up the areas to be picked up! There were jokes between the two clubs about just moving the trash from one area to the other Its annual Deschutes River raft trip will be August 20-22 - the price for nonmembers is \$90, including rafting, camping, and dinner.

FWSA will have its first annual **Dive Trip to Cozumel, Mexico, September 4-11, 2010!** The cost for the land portion of this trip is \$899 for divers (with 5 days of 2 tank boat dives), and \$599 for non-divers. This package includes round trip transfers from the Cozumel Airport, 7 nights at the Wyndham Reef Club (double occupancy), all

FWSA Cruise September 25-October 2, 2010 - Leaving Boston, visiting Portland, Maine; Bar Harbor, St. John, New Brunswick, Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Boston. The Cruise Company is putting together a package for this cruise. There will also be a package prior to the cruise to tour the Boston area. Rates range from approximately \$626 to \$1,016 depending upon the cabin chosen (cruise only; transportation to ship at your cost). See flier.

How about a really memorable way to celebrate the new year in 2011? FWSA is joining Holidaze Ski Tours for an **Antarctica Adventure & New Year's Eve in Buenos Aires December 29, 2010-January 12, 2011!!!** Participants will leave December 29, 2010, for a 15 day trip with 3 nights in Buenos Aires, followed by a flight to Ushuaia and a 10-day cruise on the MS Fram. The cruise includes meals, lectures, guided tours and many fantastic locations and sights you have only seen on TV, including whales, seals, penguins, icebergs, snowy peaks, ice cliffs, and much more! The last night will be at a hotel in Ushuaia. Prices including airfare from JFK or LAX start at approximately \$5,800 pp/do including extra charges, and go up from there - but this is probably a once in a lifetime opportunity!

NWSCC is now accepting \$100 deposits for the 2011 FWSA Ski Week in Sun Valley (January 22-29, 2011).

The resort that boasts America's oldest ski lodge is a favorite destination for us in the Northwest, and this trip is filling up fast. Your deposit now will guarantee you a spot and increases the likelihood of receiving your 1st choice of lodging. Depending on lodging, the trip price ranges from \$895 to \$1325 per person, without transportation (consider that Sun Valley's daily lift tickets are \$82 this year!). A new option this year is an amenities-only package. If you have access to your own lodging at Sun Valley you may purchase an "amenities package" that includes registration, racing, parties, picnic, banquet, and the 5 days of lift tickets included. We should know the final price of this amenities only package soon, but a \$100 deposit is still necessary to hold that reservation.

See the attached Sun Valley flier to determine what type of lodging you would like to request. There's lots of flexibility with this trip. If you don't want to use all your lift tickets, their value may be applied to other activities, including lessons, dining and entertainment, ice skating and lunch, massage, gifts, or even helicopter skiing! Children are welcome on this trip, but there is no special child's pricing.

Senior discount pricing is uncertain, but will be answered soon.

This is a great trip from the Northwest, as Sun Valley is within driving distance for most of us, saving the cost and hassles of air travel. However, if you wish to fly, FWSA will arrange air and shuttles. 80 spots are reserved on this trip (and the last time FWSA went to Sun Valley there was a waiting list), so send your deposits now. Due to demand and popularity of the destination, NWSCC maybe forced to give up our unsold spots at the end of July - so **GET YOUR DEPOSIT IN NOW!** Contact Barbara Bousum with questions at travel@nwskiers.org.

Interested in a **chance to WIN a spot on the FWSA Sun Valley trip** valued at \$950+? NWSCC will be selling tickets, with the drawing to be held at a time to be announced. The cost is \$20 for one ticket or \$50 for three tickets. The winner will receive one fully paid trip with condominium lodging (transportation not included; an upgrade to hotel lodging would be at the winner's cost). If you have already paid a deposit at that time, your deposit will be refunded. Tickets are available through Sheri Parshall or other NWSCC officers. U.S. Marks Second Best Ski Season - the National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) released a preliminary report indicating the U.S. ski industry recorded 59.7 million visits, its second best season ever! According to the NSAA study, all regions except the Northeast achieved substantial gains in total visits. The Pacific Southwest had a 15 percent increase in skier visits, and the Midwest and Southeast experienced gains of 7.2 percent and 6.7 percent. The Rocky Mountain region continued its dominant overall position in total visitation, increasing by 3.4 percent over last year, and again exceeding the 20 million visit threshold. The Pacific Northwest resorts rose from 2008-09, growing by 3.2

percent, but the Northeastern resorts visits decreased by a projected 2.7 percent.

Vail Resorts Announce Summer Construction - Vail Resorts will spend \$75- 85 million on improvements this summer for the 2010-2011 winter season. Construction will include replacing Vail Mountain's High Noon Lift (Chair 5) with a high-speed quad that will continue to serve Sun Up Bowl and Sun Down Bowl while cutting ride time from 12 minutes to 6, with an uphill capacity of 2,400 people per hour. Vail's Adventure Ridge will also get additional tubing hill lanes and a new enclosed lift. A new 14,750 square-foot restaurant will be built at the top of Heavenly Mountain Resort's gondola.

Get Up-to-date Airline Luggage Information - Check out www.luggagelimits.com for up-to-date information about surcharges and weight limitations on luggage for your club's next trip. The site provides current information on hundreds of airlines worldwide, so it might be a good idea to include a link to this website in your trip information packets or your club's website.

Russia to Build 5 New Ski Resorts - Russian President Dmitry Medvedev has announced that five new ski resorts will be built in the country's southeastern Caucasus mountain range, which divides Europe from Asia and includes the highest peaks on the European continent. The new resorts will be built under a public/private partnership. Medvedev hopes the resorts will provide greater stability in the region, which is frequently attacked by insurgents. The five resorts will occupy almost 10,000 acres with more than 500 miles of ski runs when operational by 2020. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2011.

Beginning in the October 2010 Newsflash, they will list familiarization trips that are available to America's ski club officers. Officers of ski clubs must fill out an application to apply to go on each trip so that the resorts, tour operators, etc. can invite those clubs that fit their criteria for each trip. Those ski club officers who wish to explore new destinations and trip concepts are urged to keep checking the FAM trip section of each monthly Newsflash.

From the FWSA News:

Snowbird Proposes Second Tram Up West Twin Snowbird, UT - As part of Snowbird's proposed expansion into Mary Ellen Gulch, the Utah ski and snowboard resort has filed for an amendment to its master plan that calls for a second aerial tram from Hidden Peak to the 11,489-foot summit of West Twin Peak. The master plan amendment was proposed last month to the U.S. Forest Service's Salt Lake Ranger District, which is expected to act on the proposal by this fall. If approved, it will require a full-blown

Environmental Impact Statement and is sure to draw the ire of local environmental groups.

Womens Ski Jumping Gains World Cup Status - Antalya, Turkey, June 7, 2010 - Beginning in the 2011-12 winter season, the women's ski jumping worldwide circuit will be elevated to World Cup status. The decision was reached last week at the Council Spring Meetings, held in Antalya. FIS officials cited the success of the women's ski jumping Continental Cup tour held since 2004-05. The decision is largely seen as a boost to efforts to include women's ski jumping in the 2014 Winter Olympic Games, to be held in Sochi, Russia. The International Olympic Committee (IOC) officials cited reasons ranging from the medical effects of ski jumping on women's bodies, to lack of worldwide appeal of the sport in explaining its decision to not include women's ski jumping in the 2010 Winter Olympic Games in Vancouver.

There is a major crisis in the ski and snowboard world. Few people are aware of the big problem and no one is doing anything about it. In Colorado a winter or so ago, seventeen skiers or snowboarders were killed running into each other or into trees. Deer Valley's Stein Eriksen broke ribs, wrist, and collarbone when he collided with a small boy...and Stein had been skiing for 75 years! Some of the injured or killed wore helmets, some did not. The primary reason for the deaths, however, is severe overcrowding on Forest Service land leased to ski areas.
