RECAP, SEPTEMBER NWSCC MEETING:

Jared Montague, Director of Sales and Marketing for **Brundage Mountain Resort**, was our featured speaker at

our first meeting held at the Buffalo Gap. Brundage is beginning its 48th year of operation, and more has happened under new ownership in the last three years than in most of the prior years combined. Two new lifts were installed last year: the Bear Chair, which services a new learning area, and the Lakeview triple lift on the back side of the mountain, which opened up 160 new acres of skiable terrain. The addition of the two new lifts more than doubled the uphill capacity of the area! More upgrades are planned and are based upon Forest Service approval: the Centennial Triple will eventually be replaced with a high speed detachable quad, and the resort is considering adding another 1,000 vertical feet of terrain below the area in which they currently operate, eventually giving Brundage 3,000 vertical feet of skiing on 3,000 acres, and making it one of the larger ski resorts! A land swap with the Forest Service gave Brundage 338 acres along the base of the mountain, providing the opportunity to build future ski-in, ski-out lodging and new base area facilities where the lower parking lot is currently located. The plans include clusters of lodging among the trees, so this won't be a "high rise" development, but will keep its family friendly atmosphere.

Brundage received 428" of snow last year, and tends to have "the best and the most snow in Idaho." It also offers Snow Cat skiing on 19,000 acres adjacent to the ski area, with two Snow Cats running full and half day options. A full day of Cat Skiing is \$299 per person, including lunch, and the half-day option runs \$199 per person and includes plenty of hearty snacks. Rent the entire cat for your own group and this Private Snow Cat Adventure could cost as little as \$181 per person. A 6% sales tax applies to all pricing.

Brundage and Tamarack are both located within a short drive of McCall, Idaho, and have teamed up to offer a special 4 out of 6 day lift ticket offering two days at each area for a special price of \$144 (including tax; does not include lodging) - only available by contacting Jared at jmontague@brundage.com or 208-634-4151 x 125 - tell him you are with NWSCC. Jared can also assist with offering lodging in McCall through the Whitetail Club, and is offering a special FAM trip February 19-22, 2009, for ski clubs who are planning trips to Brundage - contact Jared for further details

Mt. Hood Meadows received two National "Heads Up" Safety Awards from the National Ski Areas Association! Way to go, Meadows!

NOW is the time to think about your **Season Pass** for the coming year: **Mt. Hood Meadows** has announced its popular 4x4 pass for ages 23-64 will be \$444 this year; the 3x3 pass for ages 15-22 will be \$333, and the 2x2 pass for ages 7-14 will be \$222. The last day for the general public to buy these passes - ONLINE ONLY- will be November 16, 2008. The popular 10-time passes will be available at a discount at the NWSCC Ski Fair.

Timberline and Mt. Hood Skibowl are again offering their two-area **Fusion Pass** through November 16 for \$449 for adults 23-64, \$349 for ages 15-22, and \$249 for ages 7-14 and 65-70. The price goes up \$50 apiece from November 17-January 3, and another \$50 apiece starting January 4. In

addition to skiing at both areas, passholders get to ride the FREE Fusion Shuttle from December through February between Timberline and Skibowl (think no driving up the Timberline Road!). Some people may even ski the Glade Trail back down to Government Camp!

Hillcrest Ski Shop is hosting its "**Race Night**" October 9 where you can meet the reps, eat pizza, and order new equipment at special discounts - see attached flier for further details! You can still order on October 10, but the reps won't be there to talk to!

Pacific Northwest Ski Areas Association announced some improvements at our Oregon ski areas:

Mt. Bachelor has added 150 acres of skiable terrain (below Cow's Face) by connecting and enhancing the east and west "catch lines." The resort also invested \$500,000 in its lift network and improved access to the ski area with construction of a new Park-N-Ride facility in nearby Bend, purchase of an additional Park-N-Ride Super Shuttle Bus, and development of a new heated walkway at Sunrise Lodge.

Mt. Hood Meadows constructed a new medical clinic and ski patrol headquarters building in the resort's base area. Nearly 200 acres of advanced, off-piste terrain was made accessible off the Hood River Meadows Chairlift. Look for remodeled North and South lodges, with more attractive restrooms on the second floor of the North Lodge and modernizing the South Lodge's Schuss Grill.

Mt. Hood Skibowl purchased two new snow cats, one of which is a Prinoth BR350 Sherpa. This winch-equipped snow cat will groom the steeps in Upper Bowl and elsewhere. The resort also doubled the restroom capacity of Skibowl West's Starlight Lodge and added a ticket window to the outside ticket sales facility. This year, the resort's horse-drawn sleigh rides will operate out of nearby **Collins Lake Resort**.

Timberline Ski Area has refined the eight new Still Creek Basin trails (opened last winter), offering skiers and riders improved signage, trail enhancements, and more milling space at the lower terminal of the Jeff Flood Express Chairlift. Timberline also improved its beginner hill, which has been outfitted with a Magic Carpet Ski Lifts® conveyor.

Hot news from the **National Ski Club News**: Resorts, retailers, suppliers and education associations involved with the snow sports industry are gearing up for Learn-A-Snow Sport Month is January. Companies, associations and venues participating in the outreach initiative will offer special free or discounted learning packages for kids and adults who want to learn an

outdoor winter activity. Most packages for alpine skiing, snowboarding and cross country skiing will include rentals, lifts and lessons provided by trained instructors at resorts. Learning programs will be posted on www.winterfeelsgood.com and will include links for details about each program. Offers will vary according to the location. The goals for this national effort are to break down the barriers to participation, enable people to learn "best practices" at a reasonable cost or for free, showcase the health and wellness benefits of snow sports and convey how much fun snow sports are for children and adults.
