


# What To Splurge On & What To Save On At Home, According To Interior Designers


## **Splurge: Unique Lighting**




#### Save: Bathroom Finishings

"In the bathroom, the biggest area you can save on is the tile. Stick to ceramic!" share Meghan Hackett-Cassidy and Erin Hackett of Hackett Interiors. "We love to use a simple white subway tile on the walls and either a penny round or small hexagon on the floors. You can have some fun by introducing pop of color in the floor tile and using a grey grout throughout."

"I highly recommend going with chrome fixtures, especially in a bathroom. Often times, chrome will save you a good amount of money instead of polished nickel or a custom finish. It's a great way to save on money and not sacrifice the look of the space," adds Jess Cooney of Jess Cooney Interiors.

"Splurge on a beautiful, high quality rug because it will last so much longer then an inexpensive rug and will make the entire room look expensive," suggests Travin.




#### Save: Vibrant Art



"If you're only going to splurge on one item, a high quality sofa is an investment that is guaranteed to elevate your home and be worth your money," says Eisen.




# Save: Easy Window Treatments






# Splurge: A Dining Room Table You'll Want To Dine At
