Effects of 2016 Drought

As described in past newsletters, a few faithful supporters of White Dove have purchased property in Santa Clara with plans to grow various crops that would begin to generate income for support of White Dove. This was to be the year when the first crops would be harvested and sold. Plantains, limes, and cacao would be the first to be ready for market.

Just as the first load of plantains was maturing, a fungus spread across the mountains and almost wiped out that crop. But then came a drought across Honduras, effectively preventing any salable crops of any kind this year for White Dove. So the hopes for a turnaround this year toward White Dove becoming more self-supporting were dashed. Now things are very tight financially and White Dove is operating at a deficit. If there's any way you can contribute to help them get out of that hole, now is a perfect time.
