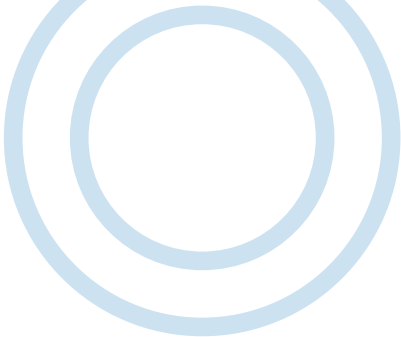

# PRESIDENT’S REPORT

At a recent meeting, our Club Captain, Shane Punter, provided a very interesting analysis of our patrol season. The details are included in Shane’s report. At that meeting and at the Annual Awards Night where I touched on such data, I reiterated my words that in my opinion, we are one of the most professional surf lifesaving clubs on the Sunshine Coast. This is all due to the efforts of everyone within the Club who have put in, and that has been fantastic.

To all the Committees and everyone who does patrols, assists with camps, runs training programs, assists with nippers etc. etc., you have taken this club to be one everyone should be extremely proud of. As I said, you all should be very proud of yourselves and the Club you put so much into. As we all recognise this does not happen without the great efforts put into by many. I won’t include names, as throughout the attached Officer’s reports, all such people will be identified.

LOOKING FORWARD

1. Strategic Plan 2021:

The Board has recently developed a Strategic Plan to set guidelines for development of the club for a minimum of the next three years. This is a powerful document, as it sets a direction for us, whilst making each of us accountable to ensure our strategies are successful. The one major item we spent considerable

time on, was addressing our values through our value and Mission Statement on page 2 of this document.

Over the last eight years when I have been Treasurer and President, I have seen our Club go from one where we were under review by our Branch, to now where we are living our values and there is a want within the Club to grow and develop.

# CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

## Shane Punter

Congratulations to all active members on another amazing patrolling season at Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC in 2017/18.

To say we had a successful season is significantly understating what we achieved as a group of volunteers. We can quantify this success by looking at some key statistics.

Over the course of 8 months from September to May we captured the following data:

- » 168 active members across 11 patrol teams, conducted 156 patrols consisting of a total of 8449 patrolling hours! At an average of 50.3 hours per member, that's one and a half weeks of full time work. Each.
- » Our Active Club members also provided some 1,200 hours of Operations Support for Sunshine Coast Branch, and Nipper Water Safety
- » During the course of these patrols we performed:
  - » 3723 preventative actions (that's 22 each) and
  - » Looked after 328 people requiring first aid treatment and
  - » Performed 48 rescues. 1 for every 3 patrols. All of these were successful, and thanks to your efforts, we recorded zero fatalities for the season across our beaches.

As impressive as these statistics are (and they are), I believe that the greatest measure of our success this season goes much deeper than these numbers indicate. We can't measure the way that we all worked together as a team to ensure that our commitments were fulfilled week to week. The number of times we volunteered for each other to make sure we

didn't leave our mates short. It's hard to measure the moments we had to work as a team to create unique solutions to confronting circumstances which came our way. Some of these were life-threatening and others were just to make people feel safer on our beach. We definitely can't count the number of times we taught, mentored or supported each other, nor the number of times we learnt something new from a team mate. There's no way to know the number of times we shared a laugh and enjoyed each other's company. All of these "un-measurables" are the glue which holds us together as a club. The things that make us want to be there to help each other and ensure we achieve our collective goals. In short, the greatest indicator of our success as a Club is our people.

Looking forward to 2018/19, we are aiming to add at least one new patrol to our roster. To accomplish

this we will try to take full advantage of the fantastic work being done by our JAC and CTO. One of our goals is to activate the huge potential that exists amongst the associate membership of nipper family members. Some patrols have seen a big boost over recent seasons as parents join their children as patrolling members. We will be encouraging award members as well as Bronze medallions and SRC's to further enhance all teams. It is also our intention to increase the number of social events at the club and to integrate these with other club activities.

From my perspective it has been a privilege to hold the position of Club Captain this season. The quality and dedication of the people involved with our club made my job relatively simple, and for that I thank you all.

Across the entire season we had only 2 emergent patrol shortages and that is a great/positive reflection on all members. I would like to say a special thank you to the Patrol Captains and Vice-Captains for taking ownership of your teams and making my task so much easier. We had a fantastic turnout at our PC season debrief which was well attended by trainers and assessors also. This was a very positive gathering which gave us a lot of fresh thoughts to commence planning for next season.

I hope that everyone has a safe and relaxing Winter, and I look forward to seeing you all again in 2018/19..



# SURF SPORTS REPORT

## Matt Richards

I took back on the role of Surf Sports Officer at the end of last season with a view to rebuilding the Surf Sports culture in our club.



My approach is that Surf Sports is an excellent vehicle to engage existing members and attract new members to the club and keep those members in the club for longer duration, with a particular focus on the 13-21 age group.

The last twelve months has seen a number of new initiatives put in place, in addition to capitalising on our existing strengths. Our medium-term goal is to have Metropolitan Caloundra SLSC offering our members the opportunity to train and compete across all areas of Surf Sports – from Swim, Craft and Beach events through to Surf Boats, IRB Competition, Surf Rescue, Pool Rescue and Boardriding; and to provide those opportunities to all members from Nippers through to Masters.

### Pool Rescue.

The 2017 season saw the club field its first ever team in Pool Rescue Competition. The club fielded eighteen competitors at the State Pool Rescue Championships in July, coming away with fourteen medals including eight gold, and eleventh place overall and third on the handicap points score. This was a fantastic effort for the club in its first season of competition. A big thank you to Karen Magnussen and to Danny Short from Maroochydore for offering his time and expertise with coaching our competitors.

### Endurance Championships

Over the last few years the club has seen an increasing number of entries in the State Endurance Championships. This year we once again saw increased representation from Metropolitan Caloundra, coming away with seven medals across both Nippers and Masters, and the club placing eleventh overall.

### Fastest Man On Sand

The club fielded a number of competitors across the three rounds of this series for Beach competitors, with consistently good results. The Club placed 7th overall in the series with Thomas Basford (U12) taking Age Champion for both Sprints and Flags. Well done to our coaches Glen Wilson and Kerry Barlow for the work they have done and continue to do in the beach arena.

### Interbranch and State

The club had four members selected in the Sunshine Coast Branch team this year, being Jack Davies, Matt Magnussen, Jade Gardiner and Brigitte Nolle; with all playing a part in the Sunshine Coast winning the interbranch for the tenth year in a row. Matt Magnussen was also selected in the Qld Youth Team and represented Qld in the Youth Pathways Cup in Sydney in January. Congratulations to all of our members that won selection in both Branch and State Teams.

### Surf Boats

The club fielded two crews across the season under the guidance of sweeps Jase “Molly” Bean and Josie Pike. The crews didn’t have a lot of luck in the Senior State Championships but did come away with a Gold (Women’s >140 Years) and Silver (Men’s >180 years) in State Masters.

### Masters

The club had a small group of Masters competitors represent the club throughout the season, picking up a couple of medals at State Endurance and finishing with a couple more medals at the State Masters Championships in March; with Brooke Elsum winning a Gold Medal in Beach Sprint.

### Surf Rescue

It was pleasing to see the club field its first competitor in Surf Rescue competition for some years, with William Ashworth (U14) representing the Club in Champion Lifesaver at Branch. Well done to William for his efforts and to Kirsten Phillips for coaching.

### Junior Activities

By far and away our largest and most active group in Surf Sports is our Junior Activities. The club saw increased involvement and participation across all age groups, with strong performances already mentioned above in Pool Rescue, Endurance Championships and Fastest Man on the Sand; strong attendance at all local carnivals; and club members being selected in both Branch and State representative teams. The club had its biggest representation for some years at U11-U15 Branch Championships with strong results across all age groups and both in water and beach events, to finish fourth overall – our best overall result at Branch level for at least fifteen years, and possibly longer. We then saw one of our biggest state teams for some time, with over sixty competitors representing the club, attend the Qld Youth Championships. Once again, the club performed very well, winning twelve medals including six gold, and placing ninth (9th) overall and sixth (6th) on the Handicap Point Score. This was the club’s first top ten finish at State Championships in over ten years. Special mention to Thomas Basford (U12) who won double gold in Beach Sprint and Flags; and our U12 Female teams that won three gold and two silver in the five team events. Thank you also to our Team Manager Sharon Punter, all Age Managers and club coaches Carl Perkins, Paul Bounty, Tom Harle, Glen Wilson and Kerry Barlow for their efforts across the season and at these two carnivals.

### Australian Youth Championships

The club saw two U14 members attend the Australian Youth Championships at Scarborough Beach, Perth in April. Well done to Matt Magnussen and Noah Richards for their efforts, with particular mention to Matt Magnussen for making the final in all three individual events (Swim, Board and Iron) and winning a Bronze Medal in the U14 Surf Swim. It was a fantastic finish to a great season of competition.

In closing I would once again like to say congratulations to everyone that has represented the club in competition over the last season and thank you to all of the coaches, officials, team and age managers, water safety personnel, IRB crews and general helpers that enable our members to represent the club in Surf Sports.

The club needs as many members as possible to help continue to develop and promote surf sports within our club over the next few years and I look forward to seeing you on the beach.

# JUNIOR ACTIVITIES CHAIRMAN’S REPORT

The 2017-18 season was another successful one for Junior Activities. I'd like to congratulate all of the nippers for their achievements, regardless of what that entailed, from conquering a fear, to learning new skills, through to those who excelled with more obvious recognition in the arenas of life saving, surf sports, and leadership.

Our membership levels increased to about 350 kids (U6 to U15), which is 100 more than 2016-17. Further, it is pleasing to see that we are retaining core groups of our kids at each age level, year on year.

Our key objectives that we have strived to deliver have been and continue to be:

- » To provide (SLSQ) compliant and fun education programs for nippers to grow their knowledge, skills and confidence;
- » To provide a pipeline of patrolling members to support the sustainability of our Club;
- » To facilitate and support pathways for nippers so as to maximise member engagement and retention;
- » To have a clear set of rules that apply to all in order to maintain a transparent, inclusive and equitable culture;
- » To work collaboratively with other Operational Groups within the Club; and
- » To build and nurture 'the Mets family' ideal.

We have much to be proud of from this last season, with highlights and reflections as follows:

- » **Education:** The large majority of our kids achieved their SLSQ Age Award, with the U14 group being awarded their Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC's) providing for their first season of patrols.
- » **Surf Sports:** Participation in Surf Sports increased considerably from last season due in part to our membership growth as well as being better resourced. Results were simply outstanding with Mets over-achieving in water, beach, and (for the first time) pool rescue at

Branch, State, and National levels. We also had athletes selected for Sunshine Coast Branch and Queensland Representative teams. Well done to everyone who competed during the season and represented our Club with great spirit.

» **Support:** Junior Activities again enjoyed the unwavering support of parent volunteers, the Club's Board and Operational Group, as well as local business sponsors of our nippers.

» **Profile:** Mets' brand awareness has certainly grown over the season through Surf Sports results, and through volunteering at events such as the Commonwealth Games' Opening Ceremony.

» **Leadership:** The leadership capabilities of our older kids were enhanced through Nipper Captain roles, experience as patrolling members, and participation at Camp Commando.

» **Fun:** We had a lot of fun along the way including events such as our Halloween Night, Christmas Twilight Nippers, Surf Sports Camp, Break-Up celebrations, and social gatherings when on trips away to carnivals.

Our ambition for next season is to build upon the success of the past few years, and to better engage the kids by providing more pathways. The challenges ahead, particularly when considering population trends and that membership demand may grow, will be securing more parent volunteers in every capacity, and funding to provide for new and replacement resources, gear and equipment.

With this in mind, I'd like to encourage all family members to continue to be, or become more, involved in the Club as our sustainability relies upon it. I look forward to seeing you all next season!

Our Break-up and Presentation Day was held on 24th March 2018 where we celebrated the 2017/18 season, acknowledged the Junior Activity Committee and the legion of parent volunteers, and most importantly recognised our nippers for achieving their relevant SLSQ Award as well as handing out trophies for outstanding achievement. Once again, the September holidays' 'Lifesaving Camp' was well attended by trainees with 37 attending - 21 new Bronze Medallions (BM), 14 Surf Rescue Certificates (SRC) and 2 Bronze Certificate II Upgrades. A big "thank you" to all the trainers, water safety and other members that assisted during the seven-day camp. The feedback from members was fantastic.

We only ran one more weekend BM/SRC course for the year which resulted in 12 new BM, 6 SRC's and 5 Certificate II upgrades.

Thanks to Kirsten Phillips who organised 3 Serious Surf Skills ("SSS") Camps which were targeted at our youth members. These were generally held at the club over a weekend and included training for a specialist award as well as additional member development activities. The outcome of these camps was 8 Advanced Resuscitation awards, 12 IRB Crew awards and 6 First Aid awards. Thanks to Elizabeth Dawes and John Keller who coordinated the training for these courses.

Additionally, we had another 14 members update their Advanced Resuscitation award and 4 obtain First Aid awards at other courses. We also had 4 members who obtained their IRB Driver award, 12 obtain their ATV Operator award and 28 new Age Manager awards.

We initiated a new process for the annual proficiency test this season with 3 (which eventually turned into 4) bulk proficiency dates. The sessions ran very smoothly and feedback from members was very positive, so we will continue with that next season.

It appears that surf life saving will be staying on the path of being a Registered Training Organisation, which will only mean ever more stringent requirements for members to become qualified Trainers and Assessors. Despite these requirements, members can still actively assist with training by being regarded as 'content experts'. There were quite a few members that assisted in this regard this season and I encourage more to do so.

***It has been another busy year for the clubs small, but dedicated group of Trainers and Assessors.***

In addition to the programs within our club, we have also sent members as participants and leaders to a number of lifesaving leadership development programs at both the Branch and State levels. These programs are exceptional at providing members with networks outside the club as

well as showing them the array of opportunities open to them throughout the organization. Well done to those members who took part.

Next season we will be looking to build on what we have put in place in the past 12 months with a focus on providing more opportunities for members to get involved and more social events for members to get to know each other and have fun!

# FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT REPORT

The 2017/18 lifesaving season has proven to be busy for everyone again this year with myself taking on the role of Facilities and Equipment Officer within the club's Operations Group. The creation of this role has been quite successful and has allowed other Operations Group members to solely focus on their areas core activities without dealing with equipment issues on a day to day basis.

My aim over the last few years in the different roles I have been in, was always to aim for the continuous upgrading and replacement of the club's equipment and facilities to ensure we have the best available for our members to use throughout the year. This year, in conjunction with my other role as Grants Officer, the club has continued its success of gaining grant funding in excess of \$28,000 - which is an increase of over \$10,000 from the previous year. This funding assisted Surf Sports with new Adjustable Skis, Nippers with 10 new foam Nipper boards and for lifesaving and our patrolling members, and has allowed us to continue to plan, upgrade and replace our aging equipment on a yearly basis.

Following our clubhouse renovations a few years ago we have continued to identify improvements to these facilities by reinvesting funds that we have received

from renting the clubhouse out through the year. This included the replacement of the front door at the club to a new aluminium double door - one which I think we all will appreciate - and installing an access control system which has allowed us to manage access to the clubhouse and increase the overall security for our members.

Looking forward to next season, I am currently in the planning stages for projects and equipment replacing to be completed around the club including repainting the internal clubhouse and outdoor deck, replacing our beach trailers including Patrol and IRB trailer, along with assisting Nippers and Surf Sports in identifying their future upgrades over the coming seasons.

Lastly, I would thank everyone who has made my job easier throughout the season by looking after our equipment which has allowed us to continually give back to everyone during the season. I would also like to thank my offsidiers Dan Dwyer, Carl Perkins and Jacob Thomson who have always been around to give me a hand when I call - without them I wouldn't be able to do as much as I have done this season. I hope everyone enjoys their offseason (I know I will!) and I will hopefully see everyone back on the beach in September.



# TREASURER'S REPORT



## Simon Richards

Without trying to sound like a broken record, my report for 2017-2018 will be very similar to the past few seasons. With limited income from external sources, the club has had to be diligent in keeping expenses within budget, which I am happy to report has been achieved.

We saw a \$47k increase in our gross revenue, mainly as a result of additional membership fees (\$14k), merchandise sales (\$7k) and surf rescue appeal (\$16k) and Government grants (\$7k). A big thank you to surf appeals coordinator Kerry Barlow and every member that assisted over the weekend.

Expenses also increased by \$30k on the prior year, with the main areas being Lifesaving (\$7k), Member Development (\$4k), Junior Activities (\$11k) and Surf Sports (\$6k). It was fortunate that the club was able to increase expenses in these areas as they directly affect every member of the club. Importantly, we were able to keep administration expenses in line with the prior year.

A summary of this year compared to last year is provided below:

The main variance in Other Income was the \$174k income recorded for deck donations in FY17. There is still plenty of potential for the Club to greatly increase our income from external sources, in areas such as fundraising and sponsorship. Until we have more dedicated volunteers assisting in these areas, we will struggle to increase revenue. The Board has just signed off on the budget for the next 3 seasons, which will be updated and extended each year. Thank you to Kay Blokkeerus for her assistance throughout the season. I look forward to working with members to achieve our goals for the coming seasons.

# BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

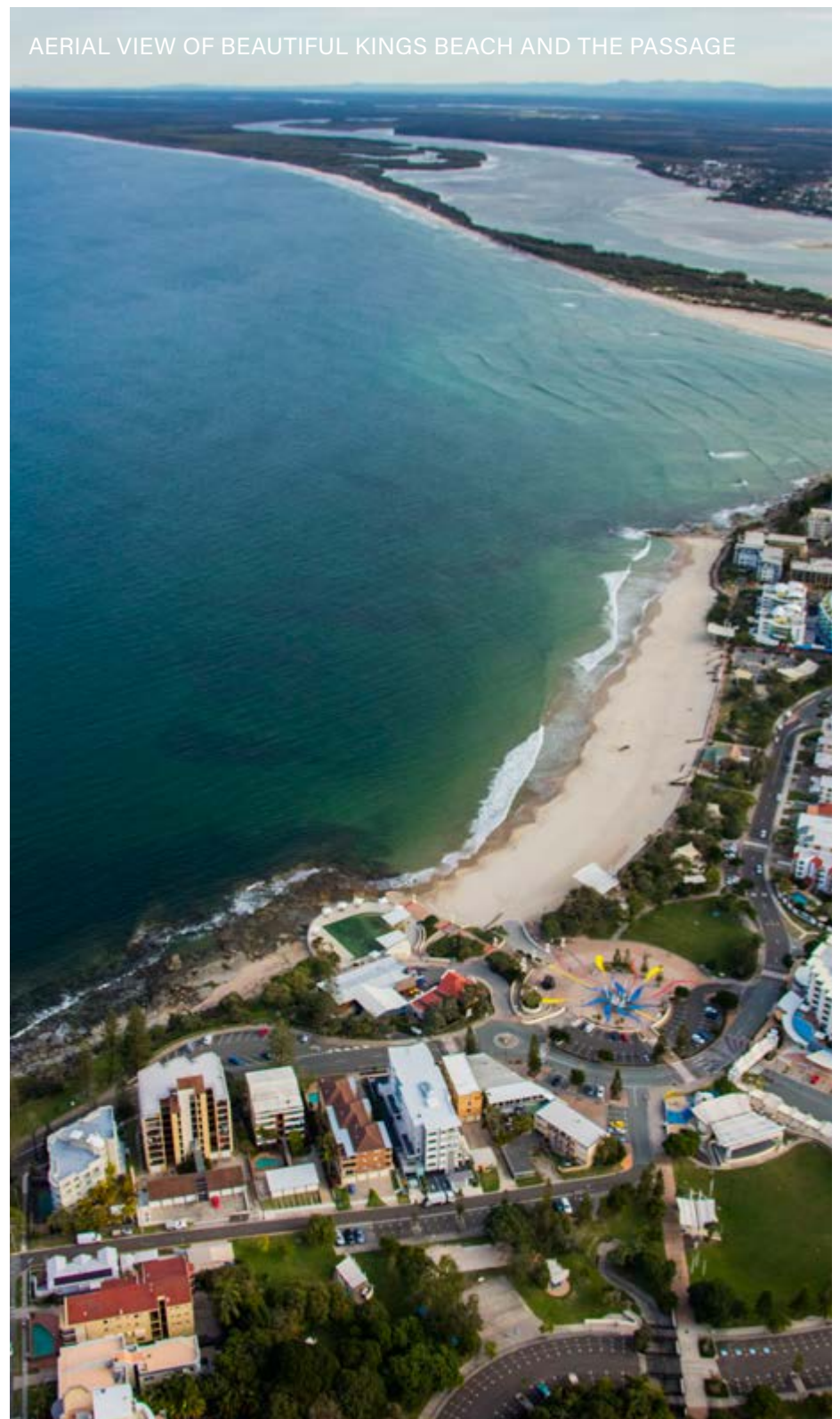
## Alan Macklin

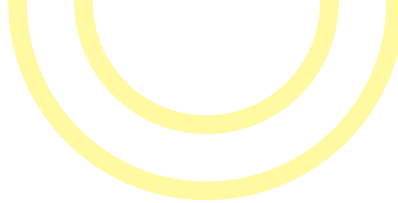

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018****Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. They do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

**(a) Income Tax**

The Club has received an exemption from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

**(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

**(c) Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

**(d) Employee Provisions**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

**(e) Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

**(f) Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

**(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

**(h) Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

(i) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(j) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(k) Accounts payable and other payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

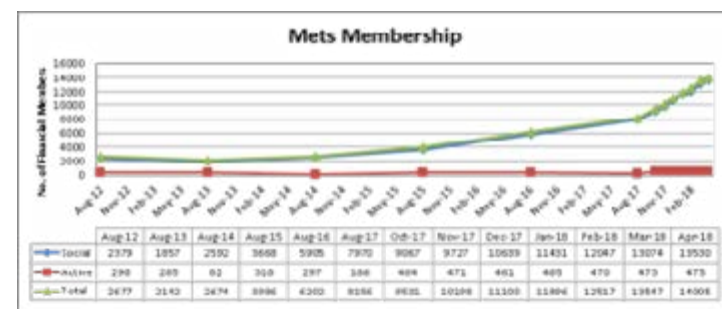
