

6. Are you willing to change **what you do**?

14 “We all fell to the ground, and I heard a voice saying to me in Aramaic, ‘Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? It is hard for you to kick against the **goads**.’

Acts 26:14

“Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus.

²⁰At once he began to **preach** in the synagogues **that Jesus is the Son of God**. ²¹All those who heard him were astonished and asked, “Isn’t he the man who raised havoc in Jerusalem among those who call on this name? And hasn’t he come here to take them as prisoners to the chief priests?” ²²Yet Saul grew more and more powerful and baffled the Jews living in Damascus by proving that Jesus is the Messiah.” **Acts 9:19-22**

7. Are you willing to **invite change** in your life?

Prayer: Lord help me to see as you see. So I will do what you would do.

NOTES

We all see the world **differently**.

1. The more you see the world the more your **perspective** of the world changes.

2. We see the world the way we see **ourselves**.

4. **Why** do you persecute me?

⁵“Who are you, Lord?” Saul asked. “I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,” he replied. ⁶“Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told **what you must do**.” **Acts 9:5-6**

5. How we see our world **shapes** everything we do.

⁸“Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus. ⁹For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything.” **Acts 9:8-9**
