

The Sacrament of Baptism calls Catholics to a lifelong vocation of discipleship - to imitate the love of Jesus and share that love with others. By opening our hearts to receive God's gift of love, we begin to love in a way that transcends our human nature. *This call to love is not just a feeling of love but, rather, it is a decision to love.*Stewardship is this conversion journey of receiving God's love and returning love to Him and His Church.

Gratitude & Prayer: Take 10+2+Family Christian stewardship is that everything we have is a gift from God. In gratitude for God's generosity, we dedicate a portion of our gifts - especially our time - to encounter Him in prayer and the sacraments. If we truly believe that God gives us all that we have, gratitude is one response. Trust is another. When we realize that God has provided for us and will continue to do so, we recognize that our real security lies in God. God, who has given us all, will take care of our future.

But we, as a community of faith, must remember that we cannot give what we do not have. In order for us to welcome others into the life of the Church, we must first make sure that our spiritual lives are properly in order. In a busy society like ours, time is one of the most precious gifts we have been given.

Take inventory of how you spend the 168 hours of a week. Are you encountering Jesus in your daily life? Are you taking time to talk to Jesus in prayer, to speak with Him as you would a friend? Are you seeking His truth through reading the scriptures? Will you make Him first on your priority list so that you are able to give to others from the graces He has given you? Do you share the gift of yourself with Him?

Take 10: Personal Prayer

Each person needs to spend time with Jesus one-on-one. A daily heart-to-heart conversation with Him is the key to personal spiritual growth. Share your joys, heartaches, pains, wishes, regrets and desire to be closer to Him. He is waiting

+2: Community Prayer

The Mass is the highest prayer of the Church and should also be the high point of our week! Consider making it your top priority to never miss a Sunday liturgy. In addition, spend an additional hour each week in the presence of our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. Teach yourself to "Be Still" and hear His call to you.

+Family: Family Prayer

Pray as a family everyday! Take to heart the famous phrase of Fr. Patrick Peyton: "The family that prays together, stays together." Choose times daily to pray with your spouse and children: bedtime prayers, a scripture verse at mealtimes, or a decade of the Rosary on the way to school, sporting events or work!

"If a father does not go to church, no matter how faithful his wife's devotion, only [2%] will become a regular worshiper."

Even if a father only attends church irregularly, 50% to 67% of his children will attend regularly or occasionally, regardless of his wife's faith practices.

Fathers Have an Overwhelming Impact on Church Attendance

"Before mothers despair... her presence [at church] ensures that only a quarter of her children will never attend at all... Her major influence is not on regular attendance at all but on keeping her irregular children from lapsing altogether... A mother's role will always remain primary in terms of intimacy, care, and nurture... No father can replace that relationship."

Fathers Play a Critical Role

"When children see that church is a 'women and children' thing, they will respond accordingly - by not going to church, or going much less."

for 10 minutes of individual prayer. Schedule this time into your phone or computer calendar, and set a reminder alarm.

Plan ahead as a family as to when you will participate in Sunday liturgy. Are you traveling on the weekend? Do you have sporting events? Make a commitment to be intentional about keeping the Sabbath day holy by focusing on the sanctification of ordinary life.

The domestic church is where faith is primarily taught. Children learn to pray primarily at home from their parents. Plan together as a family how you will pray together each day.

Goals Begin charting your course for a deeper spiritual life. Use these suggestions as inspiration. Set realistic goals for yourself and your family that will allow you to encounter Jesus and grow in relationship with Him.

Place Jesus first in your life, and do not let other priorities crowd out your time with Him.

Make Sunday Mass a priority.

Participate actively during Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation by: arriving early for Mass; reading the scriptures before Mass; serving as a liturgical minister; spending meaningful time in prayer individually, communally and/or with your family each day by; reading the Bible or daily readings; praying at meals, even in restaurants; praying the Rosary or Chaplet of Divine Mercy once per week; Lectio Divina (reading and reflecting on scriptures).

Set aside time to grow in my relationship with Jesus by: returning to the Sacrament of Reconciliation or participating in this Sacrament once per month; attending daily Mass once per week; committing to a Holy Hour of Adoration; studying the Catholic faith with others; reading Catholic books/materials; attending retreats and parish missions; cultivating the fruits of the Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control (c.f. Gal. 5:22).

Refrain from gossiping and complaining

Pray for vocations to the priesthood, religious and married life.
