9:30 AM Visit the **NCAA Hall of Champions**. The Hall offers interesting things to see and do such as a downhill skiing simulator, video games in which visitors throw real balls at moving targets and a theater video that provides interesting thoughts and experiences surrounding student-athlete academic and athletic life. You can learn about all the NCAA championship sports through kiosks that share sport-specific trivia, past champions and much more. The popular 1930s-style gymnasium is a popular attraction that allows visitors to shoot free throws and read about interesting occurrences in sports history.
