- The Greek Orthodox parts of Romania and Eastern Russia adopt the Gregorian calendar on this date, moving the calendar forward by thirteen days to March 18. - March 5, 1920
- Death of Norwegian editor and hymn writer, Elevation Heede. Altogether she had written or translated more than two hundred hymns. - March 6, 1883
- Death of Thomas Aquinas, possibly the most famous Dominican theologian, author of the *Summa Theologica* and *Summa contra Gentiles*. - March 7, 1274
